

"Applications will not be considered from persons in the employment of any firm, corporation or other employer engaged in the production of munitions, war equipment or sup-plies for the armed forces unless such a person is a skilled tradesman not actually employed at his trade." CONVICTION REGISTERED

At Trail, B.C., George Brooks, employment agent for Pacific Mills, Ltd., of Ocean Falls, B.C., was con-victed last week of unlawful advertising and was fined \$10 and costs. The charge followed publication of an advertisement, for the purpose of employing men, from which the restrictive phrase was omitted. The order in council under which

offers of employment are restricted provides that the explanatory clause quoted by Dr. Stewart must appear "in clear type in any such advertise-ment, letter, circular, notice, poster placard or other writing or docu-ment." Dr. Stewart said, however, that insertion of the clause at the head of a column of employment. advertisements will be considered summent.


