Mr. Murchison is to have made in appraisal of the fair present-lay value of all agriculturat lands in any protected area of British-Columbia owned by per-sons of the Japanese race or Jap anese company. He is empowered to appoint inspectors with authority to inspect any land "reasonably believed" to be Japaneseowned and to gather information about such land.
