**Jap Land Sales In B.C. Controlled**

OTTAWA (CP)—Gordon Murchison, director of soldier settlement, is given power to control the disposition by "sale, lease or otherwise" of agricultural land owned by Japanese in the protected area at the British Columbia coast, under an order-in-council published in an extra edition of the Canada Gazette.

The action was taken, said the order, "for the security of peace, order and welfare of Canada."

The order provides that "except with the approval of the director and in accordance with any terms or conditions therein set out, no person shall, after the date hereof:

"1. Purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire or agree to purchase, lease or other acquire, or

"2. Either for himself or on behalf of the owner, sell, lease or otherwise dispose of or agree to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of,

"Any agricultural land in a protected area of British Columbia, owned by any person of the Japanese race or by any Japanese company."

Mr. Murchison is to have made an appraisal "of the fair present-day value" of all agricultural lands in any protected area of British Columbia owned by persons of the Japanese race or Japanese company. He is empowered to appoint inspectors with authority to inspect any land "reasonably believed" to be Japanese-owned and to gather information about such land.

A fine not exceeding \$1,000, or imprisonment not over six months, or both, may be imposed on persons who do not abide by the regulations. Burden of proof of innocence is on the accused.

**Would Abolish Army Regiments**

AN EASTERN CANADIAN  
ARMY CAMP (CP)—Maj. Gen. E. F. Worthington, commander of the 4th Armored Division, expresses the opinion that the Canadian army should be one and indivisible.

A crusader for divisional esprit de corps among the troops under his command, this pioneer Canadian expert in tank warfare, would like to see the present system of dividing the army organization up into corps and regiments abolished.

In an exclusive interview with the Canadian Press at his Eastern Canada training camp Gen. Worthington said that when a man enlists he could join the "Royal Canadian Army" just as an airman enlists in the "Royal Canadian Air Force" and a sailor in the "Royal Canadian Navy."

"If you do that you will wipe out a mass of administration," he said. "I would like to see this army brought up to date."

In the 4th Division now practically all officers and men wear the black beret and the badges of the armored corps. Regimental caps and badges are passing out of fashion although the general has not yet insisted on complete uniformity. That is the way he wants it. He wants his men to feel they are members of the division and not of the "Mudshire Fusiliers."

"Unit esprit de corps is all very well," said Gen. Worthington, "but it gets higher. We don't want petty jealousies between units. We don't want one unit taking pride in being better than another. We want each unit to be ready to help the other if necessary."
