Set Age-Limit For 'Pin-Boys'

A proposal to set the minimum age for "pin-boys" in the bowling alleys at 16 years, was accepted Monday at a committee meeting of the City Council. Bowling alley operators will be asked to comply with that age-limit.

In view of the fact that many of the "boys" are girls, and that some of them now employed are as young as 11 and 12 years, it was felt that action should be taken in the matter.

Large delegations from church and school groups approached the committee with regard to the matter.

Agreement to pay four claims totalling \$232 was reached by the meeting at which, in response to a question raised by Ald. John Bennett, it was stated that monies collected from others was more than the amount of claims paid by the city.

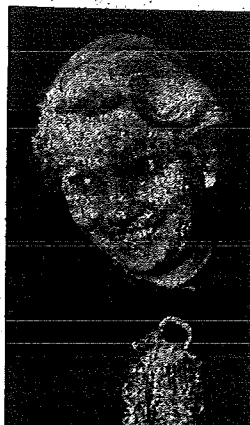
The matter of whether or not the bells should be restored to city traffic lights was re-tabled for a time while the city engineer investigates the possibilities of the use of one bell only.

The committee was informed that it was deemed inadvisable to amend the Town Planning Commission Act in order to include representatives from any group not elected, such as the Local Council of Women. But attention was called to the fact that women could be appointed from elected bodies to the Commission.

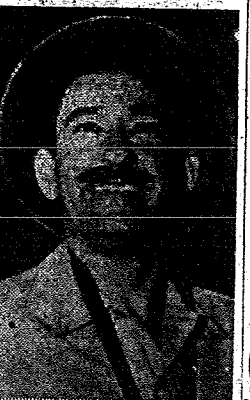

Ask Action On Jap Homes

With the National Housing Registry faced with the problem of finding housing accommodation for at least 600 families, and seeking a special interview with the City Council in the matter, the problem of the empty "Japanese" houses in this city was raised again at a meeting of the Building Committee Monday afternoon.

A request was received from Pemberton's Realty that, in view of the pressing housing needs, some definite action be taken with regard to the property of the vacated Japanese, and some manner of precedence be given to the project of making the houses habitable.

Chairman of the committee, Ald. G. Buscombe, claimed that people were anxious to get into the houses, but that they were restrained because of restrictions regarding sanitation and other measures.

The feeling was expressed that if the Dominion government were not prepared to help in the matter, the City was hampered, but Ald. W. D. Greyell said that if the government wished to step in and proclaim the houses habitable despite the city's by-laws, that would remove the onus from the city and provide the extra, badly needed housing.

Ald. Jones said it was a serious situation to allow any relaxation of by-laws to deal with only one section or one class of buildings.

In response to a letter from the Trades and Labor Council, expressing fear that the city was relaxing its building by-laws, a letter was ordered sent to the Council advising them that there were no relaxations, but that the city was, in regard to plumbing, complying with a war measures act by permitting the use of smaller pipe and elimination of certain fittings.

The subject will be taken up again at the next meeting.
