The executive board of the Amalgamated Building Workers of Canada, with 84 years of trade union history in the Dominion behind them, today started reorganization of the Burners and Welders' Local No. 4, with the objective of making the local an All-Canadian Welders and Burners' Union.

AT UNION'S REQUEST

"The officers of the Welders and Burners' Local No. 4 have asked the executive board of the ABWC to reorganize the local for them and direct them in their ultimate objective of being an All-Canadian Welders and Burners' Union, with their own autonomy, their own finances and their own bylaws and constitution," the pamphlet stated.
