

B.C. Highway Improvement Under Way

VICTORIA, July 2.—The province's \$166,000 road maintenance program has started. Hon. Herbert Anscomb, minister of public works, announced today.

Work will be carried out as follows:

Delta Electoral District—For two miles along the Trans-Canada Highway.

Dowdney Electoral District—Lougheed Highway in Burnaby, east from Sperling Avenue.

Lougheed Highway—east from North Road; Lougheed Highway at the Pitt River bridge approach; Lougheed Highway at Hatzic east, and the Lougheed Highway from a point 1.10 miles east of Deroche, Trans-Canada Highway between Hunter Creek and Silver Creek.

North Vancouver Electoral District—Marine Drive, between Fourteenth and Seventeenth.

Yale Electoral District—Trans-Canada Highway, Silver Creek bridge east, west of Hope, east of Hope bridge and west of Yale.

Grand Forks-Greenwood District—Southern Trans-Canada Provincial Highway, Grand Forks-Cascade, on three reconstructed sections for three miles.

Kamloops—Trans-Canada Highway, east of Cherry Creek.

North Okanagan—Okanagan Highway, south of Vernon.

Similkameen—North and south of Fernleigh for seven miles.

Day labor work will be carried out as follows: Alberni—Canadian Highway (Kingsway), Beaver Creek Road, Central Lake Road; Chilliwack—Trans-Canada Highway, west of Rosedale; Abbotsford-Mission Road; Mackenzie—Thunder Bay Road, Manson Road; Nelson-Creston—Nelson-Nelway Road, Salmo south four miles; Nelson-Balfour section, three miles; Thruson-Shoreacres, four miles; South Okanagan—Okanagan Highway, north of Kelowna, at Power Creek, and south of Peachland.

On Vancouver Island contract work will be carried out in Comox, Cowichan-Nanaimo, Esquimalt and Nanaimo and the Islands electoral districts.

The Malahat Highway at Langford Lake and for three miles on the summit will be repaired.

No Rush for Jap Property

Vancouver citizens are not in a hurry to buy Japanese city property which has been put on the market for sale by the Secretary of State, acting as custodian.

A further check of real estate agents who are handling properties, 167 parcels of which are open for tender until July 19, reveals that only a few inquiries are trickling in.

Most inquirers are inspecting outside of premises before asking for an interior inspection. Agents believe that most prospective purchasers are taking their time about making up their minds to buy, because nothing definite can be done until tenders expire nearly three weeks hence.

Altogether 464 parcels of city real estate will be put on the market by the government, two other groups of 167 and 130 parcels respectively to be opened for tender later.

Newsman Wins in Damage Appeal

The appeal of Victoria Charles Drury, editor of Victoria Times, from Mr. Justice Robertson's finding that he is liable in a \$10,000 damage action brought by Hymie Saperstein and Victoria Upholstery Co. was allowed by the Court of Appeal today.

Saperstein and his company sued in Supreme Court in Victoria for damages for alleged breach of an agreement to lease them the Drury Block, 1613 Douglas Street, Victoria.

The trial judge directed a reference to the registrar to determine the amount of damages.

Vets Allowed to Make \$125 a Year on Side

Confusion as to the sum an ex-serviceman may earn in addition to his war veteran's allowance was clarified at a recent meeting of the Dominion Executive Council, Canadian Legion, according to T. A. Barnard, provincial president.

"A single man drawing \$20 a month war veteran's allowance can have an income of \$10 monthly in the way of pension or from other sources and still make by casual earnings an amount not exceeding \$125 a year," Mr. Barnard reported to the B. C. executive council.

"Married men on \$40 monthly allowance with income of \$20 can also make casual earnings up to \$125 a year."

It was suggested at the conference that the legion request further amendments to federal regulations governing allowances for widows of veterans, so that all widows able to qualify should draw benefits.

Better conditions were urged for merchant navy sailors serving in theaters of war. It was felt these men should receive all privileges extended to officers and men in the armed forces overseas.

The council will ask the Dominion government to support its resolution calling for the continued observance of Remembrance Day.

Woman Cyclist Injured in Upset

Mrs. G. Park, 3377 West Nineteenth, was taken to Vancouver General Hospital on Dominion Day with a possible broken collar bone and arm, suffered in a cycling accident in West Van-

couver. Police said she was going down the Twenty-seventh Street hill on her bicycle, when the brakes failed to hold. As she attempted to turn on to Marine Drive the machine upset.
