ous aspects of social legislation has been sounded by repeated nationwide Gallup Polls and have shown that the vast majority of snown that the vast majority of ordinary citizens are today looking at the postwar years in terms of social security. But, realistically, will they be willing to pay for such plans when the time comes? Additional evidence that they will be ready to meet the cost is provided by the results of a poil conducted among a "miniature population" made un of exitature population. lature population" made up of exactly the same elements as go to make up the real adult popula-tion of the Dominion. This cross-section of Canadians was asked:

"If, after the war, income taxes are cut in half, would you be willing to pay five cents in every doling to pay live cents in every don-lar of your (or your family's), in-come in addition to these income taxes, so that the government could guarantee every Canadian enough to live on if he were out of a job?'

Because the question as to how much the public is willing to pay for jobless insurance could not be answered without some prom-ise as to the scale of other taxes prevailing, a 50 per cent cut in income taxes as arbitrarily assumed, as a base. A 5 per cent charge was also taken arbitrarily, as being probably above the average cost of unemployment insurance today.

On this basis, the public's an-

swer was clear cut: Yes, 65%; no, 20%; undecided.

Support of unemployment insurance has, apparently, nothing to do with political party lean-ings, because the majority shown above cuts through all political boundary lines, as the similarity in the following figures clearly
