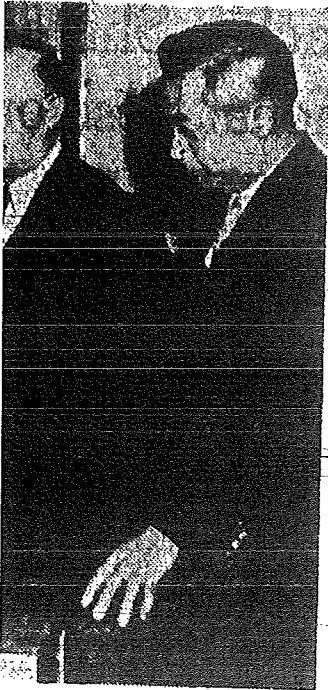

THREE PETITIONS APPROVED

B.C. Japs Win Right to Appeal Compulsory Sale of Property

Permission to challenge the right of the Federal Government in its compulsory sale of Japanese property, sought by three Japanese now living in evacuee camps, has been granted in Ottawa, J. A. MacLennan, counsel for the Japanese Property Owners said today.

Three petitions of right seeking this permission were sent to the secretary of state some months ago, but only two were approved. The names of petitioners were held back, thus blocking action by the Japanese.

Mr. MacLennan was advised today, however, that all three petitions have been approved. This now makes it possible to proceed with a case designed to test the legality of the Federal Government's order-in-council authorizing the forced sale.

TO SERVE WRIT.

The attorney-general for Canada will now be served with a writ of intention to sue, explained Mr. MacLennan. The attorney-general is required to file his defense with the courts 28 days after he has been served.

Mr. MacLennan said there was a possibility the action may be heard in Vancouver. This, however, would require the government to send a judge from Ottawa to Vancouver to conduct a special sitting of the Exchequer Court.

"We have asked that the case be heard here," said Mr. MacLennan. "They may, however, decide to hear it in Ottawa at

the next sitting of the court, which would set it back until next September, or they may send a judge to Vancouver to hear it."
