Jap Property Suit To Be Investigated

F. Drewe Pratt, Vancouver barrister, will conduct a private investigation into intentions of the Federal Government in the pending suit against the Dominion by Japanese property owners, J. A. McLennan, solicitor for the protesting Japanese, said Friday.

Plats were issued some weeks ago by the Federal Government, which granted permission for the Japanese to sue the Dominion Government in an effort to determine the legality of an order-in-council authorizing for compulsory sale of Japanese-held property.

Mr. Pratt will seek to speed up Ottawa in the property suit and will investigate the possibility of a special sitting of the Exchequer Court in Vancouver to hear the case.

ment is to be given first option to purchase at the value set by nominees of the two governments, who, in case of disagreement, will appoint a third.

If the Canadian Government does not exercise its right of purchase the property may be offered for public sale with the valuation at a reserve price. There is one important reservation, the governments agree that they will not dismantle any project nor allow any private purchaser to do so without approval of the Joint Defense Board.

Further, if the pipe line is operated as a private venture, after purchase the Canadian Government may make "such regulations and conditions in order to safeguard the public interest."

The disposal clause in the agreements varies, somewhat from the general agreement on other defence projects that have been undertaken by joint government action. In other instances United States has the right to remove all removable equipment on projects which they have built and paid for.

In connection with the pipe line now operating between Skagway on salt water, and Whitehorse, it is provided that storage and loading facilities built by the Americans at Prince Rupert are included in the general reservations as to disposal. It is estimated that when the Norman-Whitehorse pipe line is finished next year the mileage will be between 550 and 600. The Skagway-Whitehorse line is approximately 110 miles in length, 15 miles of which are in Alaskan territory.
