Hotel Fined for Not Raising Pay

EDMONTON, Dec. 23.—(CP)—The King Edward Hotel Company Limited was fined \$100 and costs in police court on each of two charges of failing to observe wage control orders issued by the Regional War Labor Board.

The charges against the company arose out of failure of the hotel to implement a direction of the board to pay porters \$25 weekly.

Porters and other employees of the hotel have been on strike since September in protest against the hotel's failure to pay porters the wage set by the board.

French Rap Conduct of U.S. Soldiers

NOUMEA, New Caledonia, Dec. 23.—(Delayed)—(AP)—American troops stationed here and their administration were sharply criticized today by Governor Christian Laigret of New Caledonia, French colonial possession in the South Pacific.

Laigret, issued a prepared statement, and later, in answer to questions, spoke particularly of the behavior of American Negro troops.

The population of New Caledonia has suffered considerably from the thoughtlessness of American troops on the island," the statement declared.

Maj. Gen. Rush Lincoln, commander of American forces on the island, declined to comment.

French 'Gouged' Troops

NEW YORK, Dec. 23.—(AP)—J. Norman Lodge, Associated Press war correspondent, who recently returned to this country after nearly a year's service in and around Noumea, New Caledonia, said today he "found nothing to substantiate allegations made by Governor Christian Laigret that American troops, particularly Negro troops, misbehaved in any manner."

"On the other hand," Lodge said, "the native population of Noumea continually gouged American troops, one shopkeeper in particular having become a local millionaire by her terrific prices for ordinary merchandise."

Paintings by B.C. Artists On Display

Following the lead of a number of eastern firms which have shown their interest in Art in a practical manner, the B.C. Electric is sponsoring reproduction of a painting by a local artist for the silk screen series designed for use in service centres for the armed forces.

This is the first western firm to take the initiative in this matter, and the picture they are sponsoring is "The Lions" by W. P. Weston, ARCA, of Vancouver. Since there was a noticeable dearth of western pictures in the collection it will be a welcome addition to the group already chosen.

The exhibition of B.C. Artists' work now on display at Fraser's Ltd., Pender Street, was officially opened by C. H. Scott, principal of the Vancouver School of Art, and is now open to the public.

A large beautifully-lighted room provides a splendid setting for many small and medium-sized pictures by some of our best-known artists.

Both oils and watercolors are being shown. While landscapes predominate there are also some flower paintings.

This is the first sales salon for B.C. artists' work to be opened in the province, and an unusually attractive collection of paintings suitable for the average home are being displayed. The present exhibit will remain on view till the end of January, and it will be followed by others of a similar nature.

Jap Property Appeal Pushed

Counsel for the Japanese Property Owners' Association balked in efforts to halt, temporarily, the sale of Japanese evacuee property at the coast, have appealed to the Secretary of State to direct a special session of the Exchequer Court of Canada to hear the Japanese suit for cancellation of the sales.

This was revealed today by J. A. MacLennan, of the Vancouver legal firm of Norris & MacLennan, who, with F. Drew Pratt, are acting for the Japanese.

"We are still awaiting word from the Secretary of State," Mr. MacLennan said. "If a sitting of the court to hear a test case against the Dominion of Canada cannot be arranged for Vancouver immediately, we hope that hearings will be held at Ottawa."

Meanwhile, the Custodian of Alien Property at Vancouver is proceeding with the sale of Japanese homes, farms and other property and, according to Mr. MacLennan, although the sales are slow, nearly half of the properties already have been disposed of.

Workers Shown Industrial Films

Some thirty thousand B. C. industrial workers see films furnished free in plants every month by the Industrial Circuit of the National Film Board, Gordon Adamson, Ottawa, supervisor of the circuit, said today. The scheme was launched in May.

With Leonard Chatwin, superintendent of industrial films in B.C., Mr. Adamson has just concluded a three-day conference in which they met industrial and labor representatives.

Operating in 106 B. C. logging camps and factories, the Industrial Circuit has been welcomed by managements as "moral builders," Adamson said.
