'Back-Door' Buying of Land for Japs Illegal

OTTAWA, May 23.—(CP)—Purchase of land or growing crops on behalf of a Japanese person or company is made an offence under the War Control Regulations by an Order-in-Council announced yesterday by Justice Minister Hon. Ernest S. Laurent in Commons.

The order adds to the regulations which prohibit a citizen from providing any person who acquires or holds land or growing crops for the benefit of any person known to be of Japanese race or a person known to be a Japanese company and liable to be a Japanese company and liable to be a Japanese company.

Bitter Fight Raging In Myitkyina Streets

KANDY, Communist. — The bitter house-to-house battle for Myitkyina continued today for the fifth straight day, and official reports acknowledged that driving rain, storms and fierce Japanese resistance had prevented the attacking Americans and Chinese from expanding their foothold inside the city.

A communiqué issued in Chungking said there were substantial changes in the fighting lines inside Myitkyina yesterday, although Brig. Gen. Ben McFarlane's marauders burned new positions along the approaches to the city.

Allied planes dominated the battlefield throughout the day, raining in unopposed tons of bombs and strafing the doomed Japanese garrisons, while American heavy artillery pounded their defenses relentlessly.

Confident optimism admitted, however, that the territorial momentum runs had swung in favor of the Allies.

Simultaneously, it was disclosed that Chinese forces driving the Japanese out of the Burma-China border on the highway to Lashio.

The communiqué said heavy fighting continued in the lower Mogang Valley 43 miles north-west of Myitkyina, where Allied commandos in from north and south of Kamaing.

Cahan Charges Bank Manager With Perjury

An information charging perjury was laid today against Stephen Hope Ewing, manager of Dunbar branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, 4467 Dunbar, by Charles H. Cahan Jr., 57, former "Yellow" journalist, who was sentenced in 1938 to seven years for holding up the bank December 1, 1937.

A summons, returnable Friday, was served on Ewing at the bank today by an officer of the city police court clerk's office.

The information alleges that Ewing committed perjury in giving false evidence at Cahan's trial on the holding charge in connection with identification of the accused.

It is the second occasion in which Cahan has brought a witness against him to trial since his conviction on a charge of perjury.

A short time after he was convicted in February 1938, and sentenced to seven years, he charged Frank Willard, police operative with perjury, but the charge was dismissed.
