

Jap Move 'Doesn't Go Far Enough'

Mayor and Legion Ask Assurance They'll Be Kett Out of Province

Those who have been stiff Jap competition in British Columbia's basic industries today showered their praise upon the government's new dispersal plan to move the Japanese east of the Rockies or face possible Ottawa disapproval for lack of co-operation.

Civic and Canadian Legion officials studied the dispersal plan carefully. They welcomed them as part-way measures, then called impatiently for a sterner policy of repatriation.

MAJOR RETURN

Mayor Cornett called for specific regulations to provide that Japanese once dispersed east of the Rockies, may not return later to the coast.

His Worship was jubilant, however, over the apparent indication that the wishes of British Columbians can be heard as far east as Ottawa.

His counsellors feared that the plan wouldn't work, because other parts of Canada might refuse to accept the Japanese. One alderman thought that the opinion of Canada as a whole, not of the Japanese, should be sought.

Jack Henderson, provincial president of the Canadian Legion, doubted that his organization would alter its stand on outright Japanese repatriation.

WON'T BE SATISFIED

"I don't think the legion will be satisfied with this move," he said. "Removal from the coastal area will remove some of the danger, but not all."

WASHINGTON, March 16.—(WUP)—The American Federation of Labor today turned a cold shoulder to a proposed new world labor organization whose membership would include Russian and Chinese workers.

NOT AT LONDON
