New Ban on B.C. Jap Land Deals

From the Vancouver Sun (Sept. 27) OTTAWA, Sept. 27.—To make certain that Japanese in Canada do not acquire any further land or property in Canada until the final settlement of the Japanese problem has been passed continuing the regulations passed in 1943 in this respect.

Some of the Defense of Canada Regulations have been abrogated and it was found that the Japanese property clauses were included.

These clauses have therefore been given further validity by the new order-in-council passed a week ago.

The main clause is that "no person of the Japanese race and no Japanese company shall, except as hereinafter provided, have the capacity, after January 24, 1942, during the continuation of the state of war now existing, to acquire or hold land or crops for the benefit of any Japanese."

It also provided that no conveyance of such property to Japan after February, 1945, would be valid, and provides penalties up to \$500 or three months' imprisonment. The penalties also apply to anyone holding or acquiring land or crops for the benefit of any Japanese.

The "state of war" continues until the peace treaty is signed, by which time it is expected the Japanese problem will have been decisively settled.

Coalition Checks Esquimalt Upset

Ministers Confer as Former MLA Fails in Effort for Renomination

Political circles are still buzzing over the Esquimalt nomination where a Liberal, Cndr. Charles Beard, took the Coalition nomination from the former Tory M.L.A., Squin-Ldr. E. V. Finland, and Victoria dispatches state that the cabinet called a hurried meeting at which the upset was probably reviewed in detail.

Observers in the capital point out, however, that although the nomination violated the coalition formula, the roll call showed that Progressive Conservatives failed to send their quota of delegates to the convention.

Each party was entitled to 131. There were 117 Liberals to 87 Conservatives, and when the vote was taken 15 Tories apparently voted Liberal. The tally was 136 to 86.

Explanation given at the capital is that there is a Tory faction opposed to the Esquimalt M.L.A. What Conservatives are asking, however, is why the Liberals brought up the coalition convention in the first place, when such action was contrary to the Coalition formula.

Perfect harmony ruled again at New Westminster Wednesday night when Byron Johnson, first M.L.A. elected as a Coalitionist, was in a by-election earlier this year and he has got to sit in the House, was re-nominated without opposition by 46 Liberal and 43 Progressive Conservative delegates in Esquimalt.

It was the same in Mission Wednesday night too, when R. C. McDonald, the previous Conservative M.L.A. for Dewdney, was re-nominated, and Dr. George M. Weir, visiting Liberal, shared the speaking honors with A. B. McPhillips, K.C., Conservative spokesman.

A four-way fight in Roseland-Trail was assured as the "People's O.C.P." Wednesday night chose Ald. William Cunningham of Roseland as their standard bearer, and Social Crediters announced that a candidate selected Wednesday will be attacked at a party dance Friday.

ENGINEERS TO GLASH
In Burns Lake, Mark Connolly, Liberal, was re-nominated by the Coalitionist for Coquille and in Revelstoke, William J. Johnson, locomotive driver and president of the district Tory association, was named to challenge Vincent Segur, another railroad engineer, who won for the O.C.P. in a by-election over a Coalition nominee.

EFF LAST CHARGES
Labor-Progressives announce another withdrawal, and two names added to their list, John Stratton has left the field in Point Grey because of pressure of private business, and now Alex Gordon and F.W. Sig. Gordon Martin will join John Goss in that three-seat riding.

Nomination interval tonight centers mainly on whether Fred Hume, ex-mayor of New Westminster, will get the Liberal call in Vancouver East, CCF Leader Harold Winch's battifield. The meeting is in Polish Hall.

Tory Predicts New Nominee in Esquimalt

VICTORIA, Sept. 27.—Frank H. Davey, president of Nansimo Federal Progressive Conservative riding, won't resign his presidency, and promises there'll be an independent Conservative candidate in Esquimalt riding.

"I don't know who it will be, but the Conservatives there are mad enough to run their own man," Mr. Davey said today. "I'm sure they'll pick one."

This is an upshot of Tuesday night's nomination meeting, which chose Commander Charles T. Beard, a liberal, as Coalitionist candidate, over Squadron Leader V. V. Finland, Conservative and former M.L.A.

Mr. Davey, who has become the storm centre of opposition in the Conservative ranks to coalition plans on the lower Island, flatly rejected the demand of Cowichan-Newsweek Association that he resign as president of Nansimo association. They asked it because he is sponsoring Major L. H. MacQuinn as an independent Conservative against the coalition in Saanich riding.

Mr. Davey said Cowichan-Newsweek is "confusing the issue" by mixing in provincial politics.
