LONGSHOREMEN DRAFT DEMAND

Negotiations for a new long shore agreement at Vancouver are expected to start shortly. The longshoremen, it is understood, have decided what they will ask for, but have not yet officially approached the Shipping Federation.

While details of the demands are not made known, it is believed they will very closely approximate those made at San Francisco. This would be \$130 an hour, for a five and a half day week, with no work from Saturday noon to Monday morning...

The men also, it is understood, will ask for annual holidays with pay. Present rates at Vancouver are \$110 straight time and \$165 overtime.

Court Hearing Set May 7 On Rose Plea

MONTREAL, May 3.—Mr. Justice WILBUR said the Court of King's Bench today set May 7 as the date for hearing of two motions submitted by the Defence Counsel Joseph Cohen on behalf of Fred Rose, Labor-Proctor M.P. for Montreal-Carrier, charged with offences under the Official Secrets Act and with conspiracy.

APPEALS IN COURT

Rose made a pro forma appearance in the King's Bench Court this morning at the opening of the May sittings. His trial has been set for May 20 and he is free on bail of \$25,000. He was not called to the box but was told to report to the court against next Tuesday.

May Equalize Milk Subsidy
