Records Show Goering Unrepentant at Death

BERLIN, July 24 (AP)—Unrepentant Hermann Goering went to his self-inflicted death with regrets that he had not been "completely ruthless" and "completely exterminated the Czechs and the Jews," records now in possession of United States authorities show.

The records are conversations he had with one of his counsel during the Nuremberg trial. The lawyer, Dr. Werner Brauer, Goering's assistant defence counsel, made copies of his talks with the No. 1 Nazi at Nuremberg between January and July, 1946. A portion of these notes, described as "abundant in intimate information," have been disclosed to the Associated Press.
