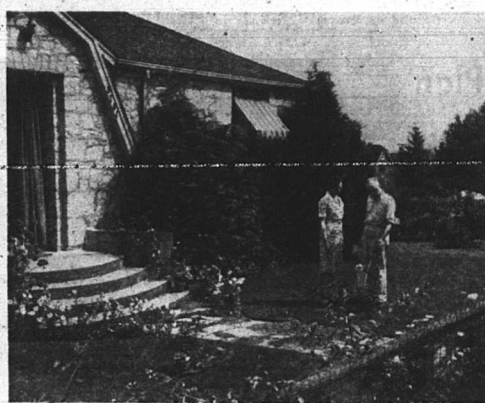

\$40 Garden Prize Came as Surprise
Housewife Enters Plot in Sun's Contest Without Telling Husband

A modest gardener who was unaware that his wife had entered his garden in the seventh annual Vancouver Sun Garden Contest, biggest and most successful yet, won a top prize this year.

S. A. Barton, 1319 West Sixty-fourth, was a surprised man when he learned he had taken the \$40 first prize for gardens with 50 feet or less frontage. At first he wouldn't believe his good luck. Quality of the gardens this year was exceptionally high and we were awestruck with a record number of entries. Thanks to the co-operation of many entrants, however, we are able to announce the results a full month earlier than was possible in previous years.

THE WINNERS: Those who were close and indeed, all entrants. I extend my heartfelt congratulations. One thing to remember is that each of you through your interest in your garden—have helped in at least one measure in beautifying Vancouver. Many factors were taken into consideration in the judging, and when final points were tabulated were necessary to check and re-check the leading gardens to assure our decisions were as accurate as possible.
LENGTHY JOB: Then to be fair, I took into consideration the time that each of our entrants was able to devote to his gardens. A retired man, for example, would have more time during the day than a busy man in such cases a small percentage was deducted from the score of the former. Varied Foods At Exhibition

There will be foods to tickle every fancy, including Russian Borsch, Viennese Schnitzel, Italian spaghetti and plain Canadian roast chicken, at Vancouver's forthcoming Pacific National Exhibition.
A special Russian restaurant to seat 500 persons is being set up on Hastings Park grounds. Peter Landchick will be in charge. Another Exhibition eating spot will be that run by Jimmy Stephens, 3446 Dundas, which will cover 6500 square feet. Seating 250, it's expected to utilize 10,000 tea bags, 4000 gallons of coffee, one ton of winners, 2000 chickens and 6500 pounds of fish.
White Spot, yet another "eatery," will feature a streamlined kitchen, including a walk-in refrigerator and conveyor-belt system of washing dishes—and 10,000 roast chickens, six to seven tons a week of hamburger and a ton of tea.
