Decision will be given Thursday by Court of Appeals on application of Power Commission to go to Privy Council in its fight to reduce the valuation placed on three hydro electric power plants it has operated in B.C.

H. W. Davey, K.C., made the request Monday afternoon on the grounds the amount involved brings the case within rules applicable to Privy Council appeals.

The appeal is from a figure of \$7,000 set by American Appraisal Co. for Nanaimo-Duncan Hydro Electric Company's assets, with the Power Commission disputing Mr. Justice Wilson's ruling that the appeal was filed too late.

Other companies taken over are West Canadian Hydro Electric Corporation and Columbia Power Co. The Power Commission offered \$4,500,000 for the three properties.

Baby Sitter Hacks Girl, Two, to Death

KEEWATIN, Minn., Nov. 25.—(BUP)—Mary Sapan, 34, an "experienced" baby sitter, said wild-eyed and nervous in the Itaska County Jail today after confessing that she killed the two-year-old child as she was hired to watch.

She admitted she hacked to death Ann General, daughter of her neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Tony General, but she could give no reason for the murder.

Police Chief Sig Lyndahl said Miss Sapan was guarded by sheriff's deputies in the county jail at Grand Rapids. He said she appeared to be in a serious nervous state.

She wept hysterically Monday as she told the jury that she had hacked the General girl twice with an axe, nearly decapitating her.

"I don't know why I did," she sobbed.

"I have always liked children. The taken care of many little children in the past and I never have wanted to do anything like this before."

Her sister told Lyndahl the General's left Ann with her and Mary while they went to Duluth. "I left Mary with the baby while I went over to a neighbor's to make a telephone call," she said.

"Almost immediately Mary followed me into the house. I felt that something horrible had happened. She looked so strange."
