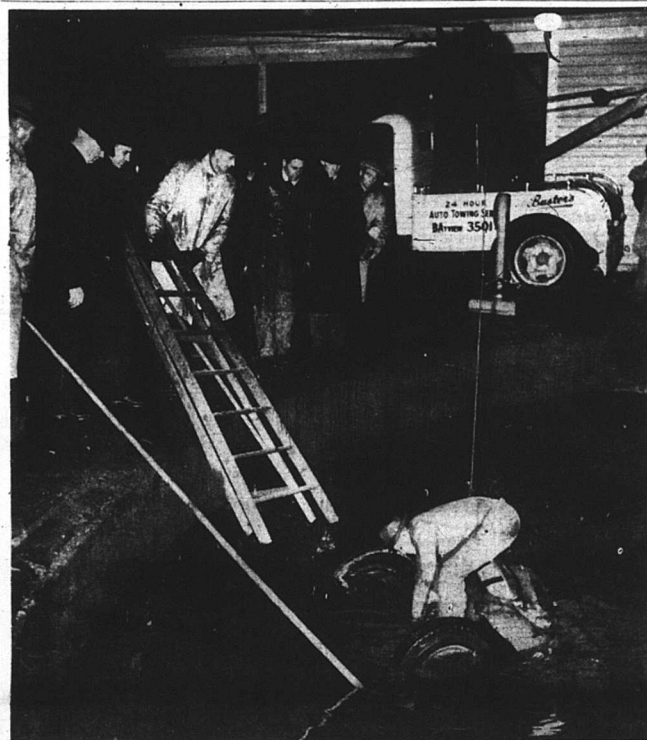


Marriage Gives Welsh Sailor Key to Canada's Closed Door

Palestine Riots Kill Thirty-Five

Hundreds Wounded in Fights By Grenades, Knives, Gunfire

JERUSALEM (AP)—Arabs and Jews fought with guns, grenades, knives and fire in the narrow lanes between Tel Aviv and Jaffa and the number killed since dawn Tuesday in riots over the partition of Palestine was unofficially reported to exceed 35.

Freighter Released

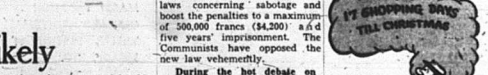

NEWLYWEDS' PLIGHT BOTHERS OTTAWA Relaxation of Import Prohibitions Likely

OTTAWA — With parliament on the eve of reassembling, and with the government "hearing from home" on its import restrictions, some relaxation of import prohibitions appears probable, along with other concessions.
