

# Japanese Counsel Asks Probe of Boat Sales

Legal counsel for Japanese will ask the Federal Government to increase scope of a Royal Commission now investigating Japanese property claims to take in deals made on 1160 fishing boats sold after Pearl Harbor.

The Royal Commission under Mr. Justice H. I. Bird opened its first hearings in Court House Wednesday.

It must only decide method of procedure and its legal limitations, will hear the first actual claims by Japanese in Kamloops on Monday.

## Fraser Elevator Lease Renewed

NEW WESTMINSTER—Lease of the Fraser River elevator has been renewed by the Seagle Grain Company Ltd., K. K. Reid, new Westminster harbor board chairman, said Wednesday. The lease, signed by the company, was now in Ottawa awaiting formal approval by Federal authorities.

The basic rental is \$20,000 plus one-fifth of a cent per bushel for exports over 3,000,000 bushels and share of the wharfage on any general cargo handled.
