

16 Mayors, 13 Reeves Given Acclamations in Province

Sixteen mayors and 13 reeves were returned to office Monday at the close of British Columbia nomination day. Two other mayors and two reeves were named to office for the first time when their candidacy went unopposed.

Of the province's 160 mayors in 1947, only Mrs. Emily D. Popoff, chief magistrate of the small Kootenay village community of Sloan City, was returned to office by acclamation.

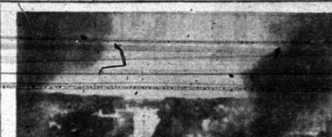
