

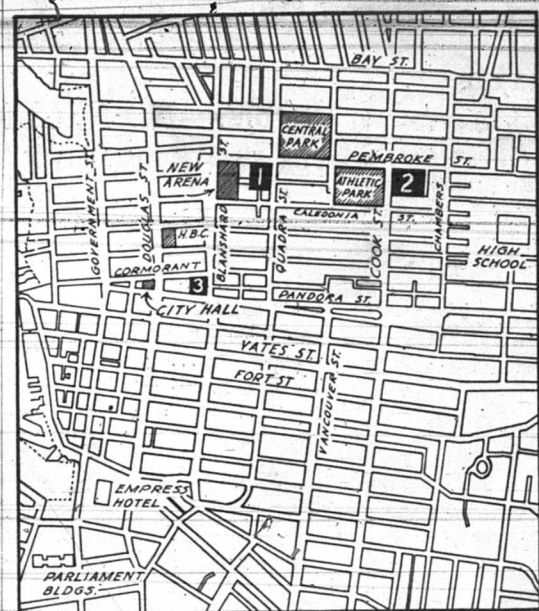
Widen Unemployment Insurance Terms
OTTAWA (CP)—Extension of unemployment insurance to monthly-rated employees earning up to \$3,120 a year was announced Tuesday by Labor Minister Mitchell. Previously, persons paid by the month were not covered under the Unemployment Insurance Act if they earned more than \$2,400.

The change will not affect the coverage of all hourly, daily and piece-rated employees or those paid on a mileage basis.

Weekly-rated employees whose earnings are not expected to be more than \$3,120 will also continue to be insured under the act.

The three sites, numbered 1, 2 and 3, from which the citizens of Victoria are to choose the site of the new City Hall are shown in the above map. It has been strongly emphasized by both Mayor Percy George, and Ald. Ed. Williams, chairman of the new City Hall committee, that the citizens are not voting to build a new City Hall at this time.

It will only be erected, on the site now chosen, should the lease of the present City Hall property to the hotel syndicate be approved next June.

The three sites, numbered in order of choice by the Town Planning Commission which was instructed to list suitable sites, are as follows:

1. Quadra Street site, being the southwest corner of Quadra and Pembroke Streets (back of the Memorial Ice Arena).
2. Cook Street site, being the southeast corner of Cook and Pembroke Streets (opposite Royal Athletic Park).
3. Blanshard Street site, being the southwest corner of Blanshard and Cormorant Streets (now used as a parking lot).

Japanese Claims Bring Tangled Problems Before Commission

KAMLOOPS (CP)—Scarcely begun, the Japanese Claims Commission already appeared likely today to lag behind schedule as fresh claims continued to pour in and Mr. Justice Henry J. Bird continued to hear applications confused and intricately based.

Seven appeals have been heard in the last two days by the Justice of the British Columbia Appeal Court, appointed as a one-man royal commission to hear claims made by Japanese-Canadians on alleged losses suffered in forced sales of possessions.

TOTAL GROWS
 So far, a total of more than \$30,000 has been asked by claimants against the custodian of enemy property, who sold Japanese-Canadian property when the latter were forced by government decision to move from the coastal sections of British Columbia during the Second World War.

Margarine Bill Up For Senate Debate
OTTAWA (CP)—The Senate gave first reading Tuesday to a bill to permit the importation, manufacture and sale of margarine in Canada, sponsored by Senator W. D. Euler, Lib., Ontario.

It is the third time in as many sessions that Senator Euler has introduced the measure. At the last session, it was rejected on second reading in the upper house by a vote of 38 to 22.

Notice of a similar bill has been given in the Commons by James Sinclair, Lib., North Vancouver, but it is believed this will not come up for debate until well after the Christmas recess.
