WINNIPEG, Dec. 30.—(CP)—Harold Hirose, Winnipeg accountant working on claims for the co-operative committee on Japanese-Canadians, said Monday claims totalling \$385,000 for properties sold and lost as a result of wartime exodus from British Columbia have been filed here by Japanese-Canadians now residing in Manitoba and Western Ontario.

Heart, Cancer Killed Fewer This Year

OTTAWA, Dec. 30.—(CP)—The Bureau of Statistics yesterday released facts and figures to show that Canada's population continues to increase, and the death rate to decrease.

During the first quarter of 1947, the natural increase in population was 61,473 compared with 41,506 in the corresponding period of 1946, a 6.1 per 1000 population jump. Life births totaled 89,312 against 73,980.

Deaths for the quarter totaled 27,837, a rate of nine per 1000, compared with 31,485, or 10.4 per 1000 in 1946.

Heart diseases claimed 7624 lives, compared with 8536 and cancer killed 3587 against 3596.

Co-ordination Of B.C. Boys' Work Planned

Formation of a Provincial Boys' Work Board to coordinate Christian boys' work in British Columbia was approved by the B.C. Parliament of B.C. in a resolution passed Monday night.

The parliament suggested the board be formed by all churches, YMCA, and other organizations subscribing to the purposes of the parliament. It recommended employment of a Provincial Boys' Secretary by the board, and accepted raising of funds for the board's budget as one of the parliament's major projects.

The resolution was proposed by Finance Minister Graham Clay, and seconded by Vernon Speer, member for Agassiz.

Recruiting of leaders for boys' work was provided in a Leadership Training Act which received final reading at the session. This would be done by establishment of leadership training centres throughout the province, and organization of correspondence courses, under sponsorship of boys' organizations represented in parliament.

The provincial government was recommended for appointing a director of alcohol education, in a resolution sponsored by Wah Lee, Armstrong, and seconded by John Horner, Kelowna.

Another resolution urged that groups represented in the parliament make an effort to attend church regularly. Tom Bulman, minister of devotional affairs, moved this resolution, seconded by Jim Rhodes, Cloverdale member.

"Never before has youth faced the social challenge it does today," Hon. Mr. Bulman said in proposing the resolution. "Youth's delinquency has gained terrific momentum in the past 10 years—our churches are empty and our courts are full."

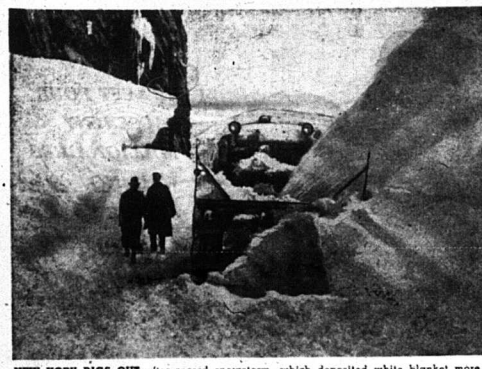

SURVIVOR OF SHOOTINGS ARRESTED

Girl, 19, Held 'Incorrigible' In Ontario Mass Slayings

KITCHENER, Ont., Dec. 30.—(CP)—Nineteen-year-old Eleanor Springer, sole survivor of Sunday's mass slaying at nearby West Montrose, who told a terrified story of being held captive by a man who slew four relatives before killing himself, was arrested last night on a charge, gist of which is that she is an incorrigible.

The girl was charged under the Female Offenders Act. Crown Attorney W. P. Clement said in court she will appear in court tomorrow.

Killed by shotgun blasts in the weekend tragedy were: Hugh Letson, 45, West Montrose farmer; Mary Letson, 40, his wife; Wilson Letson, 42, Hugh's brother; Percy Letson, 36, brother of Hugh and Wilson.

Police said the slayer, Walter Patrick Letson, 55, a cousin of the Letson brothers, killed himself with the same gun 15 hours later after drinking and brooding in the kitchen of the home 12 miles west of here. They said Walter believed Wilson Letson had replaced him in the affections of the girl.
