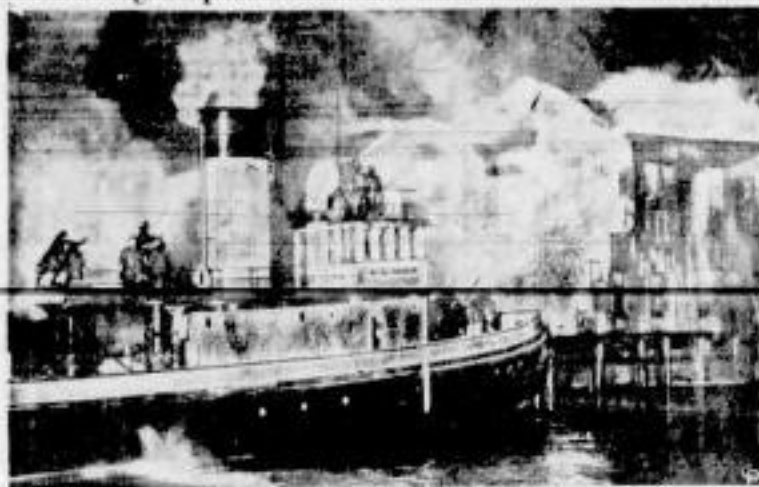


Burning Ship Sets Pier Afire to Tune of \$1,500,000

Coalition of Italian Rightists Almost Hidden by Red Campaign

ROME, Jan. 10 (AP)—A new coalition of Right-Wing parties, its members almost unopposed, won the Italian election in the Communist drive to form a "popular front" to control the April elections in Italy, was about ready for voters' inspection today.

But with the Communist-Leftist Socialist coalition fighting it out for first place with Premier Alcide De Gasperi's Christian Democrats and their supporters of the moderate Left, most observers gave Nitti's bloc no better than a third-place chance in the April voting.

Gasoline Fires Fatal to Three
