## Claim Of Former Island Japanese Heard At Inquiry

LYTTON, B.C. (CP) - First major setback of any Japanese claim heard to date occurred at the Japanese Property Claims Commission sitting here Thursday.

The claim was that of Yoshi Nitsui, Canadian-born Japanese who formerly operated a fishing vessel at Ucluelet, B.C.

The sum of \$2,560 involved included sums for the fishing vessel, real estate and personal goods and chattels. Nitsui testified he had been given no choice in the matter of the sale of his vessel. The Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee had sold the craft for \$635 and then had asked him to sign the bill of sale.

Mr. Justice Henry I. Bird, sitting as commissioner, told R. C. McMaster, counsel for the Japanese, that the claim for the vessel did not appear to come under the terms of reference since the vessel was sold by the committee.

Commissioner Bird said the terms of reference did not permit him to consider sales of vessels sold by the committee.

In Nitsui's claim for personal goods and chattels, Commissioner Bird said his stubbornness in refusing to supply the court with an inventory when he was requested to do so before his evacuation might well cost the Japanese his claim.

Nitsui told the commissioner he had refused the inventory as he had left the chattels with a friend and wanted them intact when he returned after the war.

Another claimant Thursday asked \$2,615 in respect of property near Haney, B.C. Mrs. Tazeno Hamamura, wife of Senmatu Hamamura, testified the 30-acre property carried valuable stands of fir, cedar and alder. The government disposed of the property for \$338.

The custodian's cheque for that amount had been rejected by the claimant. She alleged the land had been sold at an amount far below its fair market value at that time.

Building permits have been issued to Smith and Co. to erect auction rooms at 831 Balmoral Road, \$2,500; and to the Bank of Toronto to make alterations to 1405 Douglas Street, costing \$1,300.

## Studies Of Cattle Nutrition May Help Solve Baldness

YANCOUVER (CP) - Men, if your "crowning glory" isn't the glorious thing it should be - maybe even a little lacking in spots - you probably will be interested in experiments in progress today at the animal nutrition laboratory of the University of British Columbia.

Dr. A. J. Wood, U.B.C.'s animal nutrition expert - who has a full head of hair himself - is investigating the poisonous action of selenium, a non-metallic element. Although most of the medical field attributes the tragic loss of the tiny filaments that grow on people's scalps to heredity, selenium may be accused as an accomplice.

The experts point out that cattle feeding in selenium soil areas often degenerate into hairless, scrawny carcasses. The same poison which impacts also "alkaloid" cattle in areas of Alberta, Saskatchewan and parts of British Columbia may be one cause of baldness and debility in human beings.

Martys to the cause of better nutrition - less baldness - are the laboratory's 400 mice, 100 guinea pigs, 50 rabbits and 300 rats.

They are being injected with selenium solution and fed on grains from selenium soils. Microscopic post-mortem examinations of animal tissues in the laboratory's digestion apparatus may provide a partial answer to the problem. Unfortunately, the experts do not offer any hope for those already bald, nor do they explain "why" selenium in areas not plagued by the sulphur-like element.
