

United Clergymen In Session Here Of Cloth Attend 8-Day Parley

Clergymen from Bermuda, Newfoundland, Canada and overseas missions met in St. Andrew's Wesley Church today for preliminaries of the United Church General Council.

They arrived by special CPR train for the thirteenth General Council of the Church, the first to be held in Vancouver.

Sessions will be held for the next eight days in St. Andrew's Wesley Church.

ELECTION TONIGHT
Tonight a new moderator will be elected to succeed Rt. Rev. T. W. Jones of Montreal. His successor is expected to be Dr. W. L. E. Brown, of Toronto, who was minister at St. Andrew's Wesley from 1933 to 1938.

Many of Canada's distinguished "men of the cloth" are here for the Council. Eleven separate conferences will sit together to talk church policy.

Present are two former moderators, Very Rev. George C. Pigeon, of Toronto, and Very Rev. E. A. Armstrong, of Vancouver.

They have just returned from Amsterdam, where they attended the World Council of Churches. With them is Dr. A. J. Wilson, editor of The United Church Observer, which has a circulation in Canada of 63,000.

Dr. Gordon A. Such, of Toronto, general secretary, will report early in the Council on conversations between the United Church and the Anglican Church regarding greater union within the Protestant faith.

U.S. DELEGATE
Dr. Howard Thurman, pastor of the Central Church in Boston, is expected to attend the Council. He is a member of the Fellowship of All Peoples, which speak daily as fraternal delegates to the Council.

Dr. Thurman is an outstanding Negro scholar and a member of the board of Howard University to start his church in the United States. The commissioners to Council include 18 women, none of whom are from now active in the United Church ministry in Canada.
