Unemployment Insurance Up

Thousands More Enrolled In Government Plan

Thousands of salaried workers and wage earners who never paid unemployment insurance before will face a new payroll deduction of around 50 cents a week beginning July 3.

Everyone making less than \$4000 a year will start paying federal unemployment insurance under new amendments passed by parliament early this year.

Ship's crews who operate from a Canadian port or whose ship is owned in Canada are also required to pay.

Political activities monopolize the spotlight she said, but ordinary citizens would identify their own interests with U.N. if they were more of its work in the social field.

And U.N. would be much better off if it could do some work that was not so much a matter of social welfare as it is of social justice.

Dr. Myrdal said neither Russia nor the United States have taken any steps to solve social problems, but other member nations do.
