

Ex-Internees Get 88 Homes as Gift

B.C. Turns Over Property At New Denver to Japanese

VICTORIA (Staff) — Japanese-Canadians who remained in a Second World War internment centre can now call their homes their own.



An order in council made a gift of 88 Kootenay homes to the occupants who were moved from the coast as a wartime safety measure.

There are between 150 and 200 Japanese Canadians still living in the homes in the Orchard at New Denver, 18 years after the forced evacuation.

About 7,000 Japanese Canadians were interned in the B.C. interior from 1942 until 1951.

Many were born in B.C. but most moved east rather than attempt to resume their lives on the coast.

Others, particularly the older ones, congregated at the New Denver site and stayed on.

EAST GERMAN COUNTERFEIT FACTORY

We Won't Buy, but Mr. K Can Forge Us Into Red

BERLIN (NANA) — Communist East Germany is operating a counterfeiting centre on the outskirts of East Berlin which forges everything from currency to fake Bundeswehr call up orders.

The East Berlin forgery establishment, described as a gigantic establishment, "easily the largest outside the Soviet Union." For example, the East Germans are flooding West Germany with thousands of faked letters, newspapers, railway draft notices.

American authorities pinpoint the East German forgery centre, equipped and supervised by the Soviets, as the source of much of the counterfeit U.S. currency circulating in Europe.

Some of East Germany's forgers are said to have worked for the Gestapo in forging Allied currencies. Best known example are the thousands of forged British pound sterling banknotes paid by the Gestapo to Clero, who spied for the Germans on the British ambassador in Ankara during the Second World War.

The Communist forgers consist of a half dozen nationalities, most of whom, because of their craft, have been kept at steady employment by the Communists since the war.

Because the Western nationals among them are convicted forgers with criminal records, they have no place to go, and they are forced to stay behind the Iron Curtain.

U.S. military authorities have clamped secrecy on information about counterfeit American currency circulating through U.S. military establishments abroad.
