New Wealth for B.C. Fisheries

INDUSTRY ILLS TO BE CURED PLANT LICENSE RESTRICTIONS SEVERE PENALTIES PLANNED

PLANS of the provincial government to cure the ills of the B. C. fishing industry and restore it to its former glory and prosperity, were outlined today by Hon. S. L. Howe, provincial fisheries commissioner, at a conference at the court house with fishermen and operators.

Two major changes designed to limit plants and numbers of fishermen have been decided upon: Salmon canneries and salmon dry saltery houses are to be restricted for five years to plants now in existence and which were operated or licensed for operation in 1923-25.

Restriction of licenses to plants will also apply to the pilchard and herring fisheries until such time as the result of present investigation into the possibility of depletion has been received, the minister announced.

Amendments to the present provincial fisheries act will be necessary and the whole question will therefore come before the legislature.

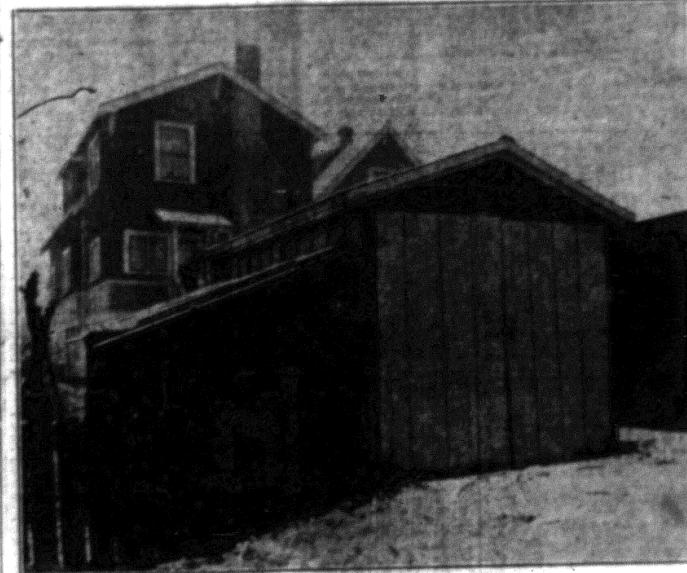
B.C. CONTROL OF FISHERIES Industry Favors United Jurisdiction

RESOLUTION ENDORSED Regarding the motion to restrict canneries and other plants to existing fish from a quantity of fishing gear stipulated for each in the House, Hon. M. Howe said that while jurisdiction over fishing licenses is divided, within the province of the province, the government was especially in sympathy with the fishermen of the province, asking the Dominion government for jurisdiction of license for four weeks to prevent interference with their own catching.

CITY COMBED FOR GUNMAN

TAILOR AND WIFE WOUNDED 'MONEY, OR I'LL KILL YOU'

A CITY-WIDE search is being made for a masked gunman who shot down Mr. Frederick Perrin, 52-year-old tailor, and his wife, Belle, 48, outside a garage at the rear of their home, 425 East Twenty-third avenue, shortly after 1 o'clock Sunday morning.

While 22-year-old Gladys Perrin listened to the shots and her parents' screams, the bandit, unnerved by the refusal of his demand for money, fired a bullet into Mr. Perrin's chest. When the plucky Mrs. Perrin clutched him by the knees he shot her through the back.

Three brothers named Mitchell, living on East Twenty-fourth avenue, arrived just too late to effect the capture of the holdup man, after they heard shots and shouts for help.

An important clue to the identity of the gunman was found by police today as the Perrins lay in a serious condition at the Vancouver General hospital.

Mrs. Perrin regained consciousness after the bullet was removed Sunday. This afternoon she was reported to be improving, though not yet out of danger. The lead from a .38 calibre gun pierced the kidney, grazed the lung on the left side and lodged in the bowel.

An operation was performed on Mr. Perrin this morning to remove a bullet buried near the base of his spine. Mr. Perrin deflected the course of the pellet and his condition was reported favorable.

Public indignation is running seven-high through the city as a result of the shooting outside of a garage at the rear of the Perrin home, 425 East Twenty-third avenue, where a masked gunman shot down Mr. Frederick Perrin, 52-year-old tailor, and his wife, Belle, 48, shortly after 1 o'clock Sunday morning.
