- April 28,1946 Atagi inquired about personal property, but did not give any details of what this consisted of. Atagi had not reported property left at Mayo Lumber Co. Camp, Paldi, previously. Neither the Mayo Lumber Co. nor the Custodian had any record of goods of this man being found. Atagi so informed May 22,1946.






