OWNERSHIP: The Commandant of Angler Internment Camp on December 11, 1942 reported
to the Custodian "The above Internee(Chikao George HORI) has been shown
a copy of your letter regarding the property at 927 East Georgia Street
and he states that this property is now entirely owned by his Mother, so
the rent should go to her".

CLASSIFICATION: The location is convenient for small houses but not very desirable.
The lot is 25 feet by 122 feet and the side fences are falling over.
The wood walks are not in good condition.

The house is a small 1 1/2 storey building on wood post or sill founda-
tion, cheap siding walls and shingle roof. The foundations seem to be
defective as the floors are weak in places and subsiding. The siding
has not been painted for a long time and the roof is in very bad con-
dition.

ADMINISTRATION: J.O. Gill advised the Custodian on March 31, 1942 that Hatsue HORI had
given to H. Sykes a Power of Attorney authorizing him to rent the prop-
erty, and, on November 23, 1942 reported that the property had been
rented to Louis Graw from Sept. 1/42 to Nov 31/42 at \$18.00 per month. Mr
Sykes remitted the \$54.00 less \$29.65 to the Custodian on Dec. 4/42.
From Dec. 1/42 the rentals were paid direct to the Custodian by Mr. Gra
who on Nov. 1/43 purchased the property. The total rental revenue for
the 14 months amounted to \$252.00 and has been credited to Dr. HORI and
Hatsue HORI account.

Dr. HORI had an office in the Vancouver Block; numerous claims were
filed against him and a list of these liabilities, dated Dec. 19/41 is
on file, amounting to \$4500.00. A list of bills receivable dated Mar.
12/43 amounting to \$2715.00 is also on file. P.S. Ross & Sons were
appointed to control Dr. HORI's affairs by the Custodian on December
20th, 1941 and Frederick Field appointed Liquidator February 18th, 1943

P. S. Ross & Sons reported July 27th, 1943, all of Dr. HORI'S office equipment and furniture disposed of, and their final report of liquidation, reporting a total of 39% of dividends was received by the Custodian on April 30th, 1946. This property comes under Personal Property and details are not here given. Dr. HORI, on October 10th, 1942, protested the sale of his equipment. Frederick Field was released from his duties as Liquidator on May 20th, 1946.

APPRAISAL:

D. W. Reeve reported the market value of the above Real Property as being \$500.00, on October 21st, 1943.

ADVERTISED:

The Custodian, on September 20th, 1943, authorized P. S. Ross & Sons to sell the property known on 927 East Hastings Street and it was advertised for sale on September 25th, 1943.

OFFERS:

The sale tender for the property was from the tenant, Louis Graw, \$500.00. This offer was increased October 26th, 1943, to \$650.00.

SOLD:

To Louis and Mary Graw for \$650.00 cash as at November 1st, 1943. Approved by the Advisory Committee 18-11-43.

TITLE:

CT 94905-~~3~~ issued on February 1st, 1944 names of Louis Graw and Mary Graw, held at the Land Registry Office to their order. Mr. and Mrs. Graw were so advised on February 4th, 1944.



This property was purchased by Dr. HORI under Agreement for Sale from Mrs. A. Eckman June 12, 1941 for \$2900.00, on which he made payments aggregating \$585.00. The premises were occupied from date of purchase by Mr. and Mrs. Jujiro HORI, parents of Dr. HORI, until their evacuation on July 31, 1942. At the latter date the taxes of 1941, \$144.74 were unpaid and 1942 due, and Dr. HORI's equity being less than ~~\$300.00~~ taxes P.S. Ross & Sons, then in control, recommended that a Quit Claim to Mrs. Eckman be procured and with the approval of the Custodian this Quit Claim was executed and delivered to P.S. Ross & Sons on August 28, 1942 and sent to Mrs. Eckman's Solicitors, Collins Green & Eades on August 29th, 1942.

This is the property referred to by Dr. HORI in his letter of August 21, 1942 to Pedro E. Schwartz, Consul General of Spain, Montreal. It is to be noted that the Quit Claim for execution by Dr. HORI was sent on August 8th to the Commandant of the Angler Internment Camp, where it was probably received eight or nine days prior to the date of Dr. HORI's letter to the Consul.

Mrs. Eckman also addressed a letter dated August 12th, 1942 to Harold Winch, M.L.A. complaining of the delay in regaining possession of the property. Dr. HORI states both his parents were invalids and intimates that their enforced vacating of the premises on August 1st was a hardship. File does not reveal that Mrs. Eckman had been advised, prior to the date of her letter, that it was proposed to Quit Claim title to her, but it would seem reasonable that her consent to the proposal had been obtained by P.S. Ross & Sons.

GENERAL MEMORANDUM

March 25, 1949

File: XI. 213 - Dr. George Chikao HORI, Reg. No. 15127

February 18, 1943, Frederick Field was appointed controller of the property of Dr. Hori with such powers as are exercisable by a liquidator.

Report on Liquidation as at March 31, 1946, dated April 25, 1946, was received from Frederick Field.

Claims filed with the Liquidator totaled \$3,886.82. Payment of 39% was made to each creditor by the Liquidator.

May 20, 1946, Releases of Control of P.S. Ross & Sons and Mr. Frederick Field were executed.

May 20, 1946, all property of Dr. Hori was divested from the Custodian and released from the control and management of the Custodian.

May 18, 1946, the Liquidator turned over to the Custodian the sum of \$129.24, being the balance remaining from liquidation of Dr. Hori's property after the 39% payment made to Dr. Hori's creditors.

June 17, 1946 payment of \$75.00 for services was made to P.S. Ross & Sons from the funds credited to the account of Dr. Hori, leaving a balance of \$54.24 in the account.

May 27, 1946, we notified R. Gerard Sampson, attorney for Dr. Hori, of the releasing from the control of the Custodian of the property of Dr. Hori and informed him that he was in a position to act for Dr. Hori in regard to collection and suit of Dr. Hori's outstanding accounts.

March 25, 1949 - Credit balance in the account of Dr. Hori amounts to \$124.02, made up as follows:

Since the property of Dr. Hori was released from control of the Custodian, and since the Custodian (May 3/46) has supplied Dr. Hori's address to one of his creditors, who is free to take action against Dr. Hori to collect the balance of his account, there appears no reason why the balance of the funds in this account should not be released to Dr. Hori.

SET FOR.....

1. The above named is at present in custody in The Canadian Immigration Detention Shed in Vancouver having been arrested as an alien enemy. He is thirty years old and practises in Vancouver as a surgeon with offices at suite 407 Vancouver Block. This man is a widower and has a two year old daughter. He at present resides with his parents at 427 E. Hastings St. Vancouver, B.C.

2. Hori came to Canada in 1919 at the age of seven with his parents. He received his education here and graduated from the University of British Columbia in 1935. He took a pre-med course and then studied at the University of Chicago where he received his medical degree in 1939. He interned in the Providence Hospital in Detroit from June 1, 1939 till August 1940 when he returned to Vancouver. Hori returned to Chicago after a short visit with his parents then returned again to Vancouver in February 1941 after taking a further course at the University of Chicago. He commenced his practise in Vancouver in April of 1941.

3. This man was interviewed by the writer in an effort to obtain information as to his assets etc. which might prove of assistance to the Custodian of Enemy Alien Property in the administration of his affairs. Hori was not in possession of any of his records at this interview and the figures shown in some cases are only approximate.

4. Hori has a current account in the East End Branch of the Bank of Montreal in Vancouver showing a balance of \$1300.00 (thirteen hundred dollars). He has no safety deposit box. Hori claims to possess no investments of stocks, bonds or similar assets. He took out a \$10,000. endowment policy last month with the Sun Life Assurance Co. The premium on this has not yet been fully paid. He also has a \$1000. policy with this same company which was taken out 15 years ago but the premiums have been allowed to lapse.

5. The house at 427 E. Hastings St. is being purchased by Hori and his parents. It was recently purchased through P.C. Gibbons & Co for \$3900. but only a small amount has as yet been paid on this property. Subject and his mother, Hatsue Hori, hold jointly in their names the clear title to the property at 927 E. Georgia St. This house and lot are assessed by the city for \$700. It is rented at present for \$15. per month but no rent has as yet been collected. The furniture in the house at 427 E. Hastings is the joint property of Hori and his mother.

6. Hori drives a 1938 DeSoto Sedan which he purchased from Curtis Motors in Vancouver in May 1941, for \$975. There is still a balance of about \$600. owing on this car to the General Securities Co., Ltd., Pacific Bldg. The furniture, books and medical equipment at his office are valued at about \$4000. The bulk of this has been purchased since he went into practice and to acquire his equipment he has incurred many debts.

7. From memory he has set these out as follows:-

8. Besides the above Hori states that he has about \$400 in smaller amounts owing to various local firms. He cannot recall the details but states that these are a matter of record at his office. The office records will also show a few outstanding accounts with patients. Hori has employed two nurses at his office, Miss H. Yamashita and M. Kayahara. The monthly salaries of both these nurses are due.

9. It has not as yet been possible to check or verify the information contained herein but an effort will be made to do so at a later date in cooperation with the local representative of the Custodian of Enemy Alien Property.

We are having the furniture segregated from the instruments and will endeavour to get an offer for same which can be submitted to Dr. Hori for his approval.

In the meantime, we would appreciate your writing to the Commandant of the Camp where Dr. Hori is interned and ascertaining whether or not Dr. Hori will be in a position to earn money. His parents are quite anxious that if at all possible his instruments be preserved for his use and in the event that he would be able to earn fees at the internment camp, it might be possible to work things out to this end.





I am in great difficulty over some property and must appeal to you as my only hope in straightening matters. I will state briefly the facts. In May 1941 I sold a house in the 400 Block East Hastings Street for \$2900.00 to a Japanese, Dr. Hori. The down payment was \$350.00 and a payment of \$50.00 per month was agreed. These payments were kept up until the Pearl Harbour episode. Since that time, eight months ago, I have received nothing whatsoever!

Apparently the Hori bank account of \$1800.00 was frozen, and the Frederick Field Co. Ltd., 850 West Hastings St., Vancouver, B. C., were appointed custodians. Since December I have kept trying to get either the payments due me or my house vacated and turned back to me. I have appealed and appealed to Mr. Field for my rights and he has promised--just another week--just a few days more--positively at the end of the month: but still the Japs remained in my house absolutely free!

The question of taxes and water came up in July and I had to pay these together with the \$65.00 previously paid to Dr. Hori at the time of adjustment at the sale. So on July 3, I paid the \$290.77 taxes--and still the Japanese were allowed to remain in my house without any rental or payment. At last on August 1, they moved, and I naturally thought I had only to repossess the house--but--Mr. Field forbids me to enter it even now.

The doors are open--the place is over run--and I am helpless, yet I have received no rental or payment in eight months. You will no doubt find it hard to believe such a situation can possibly exist--that I have to be prosecuted and made to bear the expense of housing these Japs--but it is the truth!



As discussed with you a number of times, our original plan for the handling of this man's affairs was to use every effort to see that his instruments could be saved even although he had substantial debts. You will recall that, having this in mind, we enquired as to whether or not he would receive a salary for the work he was undertaking to do in the internment camp, thinking that such salary or fees could be applied in payment of his liabilities.

It now appears that there is to be no remuneration for Dr. Hori and so we are unable to expect any funds from this source. This means that the assets of Dr. Hori will have to be realized in full in an effort to pay his creditors.

We might also mention that we approached Mr. Kagetsu, the major creditor with a request that he waive payment of his claim until after the war, but so far we have been unable to receive any satisfaction in this regard from Mr. Kagetsu.

The automobile and house upon which Dr. Hori had made partial payments have been released back to the original owners and any liability in connection therewith extinguished.

We are endeavouring to make collection of the outstanding accounts due to Dr. Hori but so far have not met with very much success.

In the past two weeks, we have arranged the office equipment and surgical supplies and have now received the following offers:



How are you getting along these chilly autumn days? As for us we have left Hastings Park on September 23rd and arrived Slocan on the 24th.

We find Slocan a very peaceful and quiet little town. We like this place very much. The climate here is somewhat cooler, comparing to Vancouver, but we hear this climate is good for our health.

We thank you for all you have done for us concerning my son, George Horis' office equipments and surgical instruments.

I hope I was not too much of a bother to you in coming up to your office so many times.

Yesterday for the first time since our arrival here I received a letter from my son. He states that in near future he may be able to come to one of the evacuation centre and work for the commission.

He also stated that his surgical instruments may be able to be held through the Spanish Consul. This was certainly good news to my husband and myself.

While we were residing in Vancouver you have shown us great deal of favor. Not only this but hearing from our son about his instruments, we believe that you have put in favorable words to the authority in charge. We deeply appreciate your kindness towards us.

We are intending to live quietly here, hoping in vain the releasement of my son to Slocan will be in the near future.

This morning the frost was very heavy. It looked like snow on the ground. Although the weather is

very extreme in morning and night, in the afternoon the warm sunny weather is still keeping up.

At closing we thank you once again for everything you have done for us.

Attached hereto you will find Report of Messrs. P. S. Ross and Sons, copy of which I understand you have forwarded to Mr. McPherson.

It will be noted that they recommend early action as every effort has been made to safeguard the internee and the creditors should now be considered. I have asked the accountant to furnish us with information as to credit balances in our hands for patients of Dr. Hori as many accounts remain unpaid.

The case has already been brought to the attention of the Spanish Consul through a letter forwarded by Internment Operations Branch with our approval - see letters dated August 25th, 1942 and September 2nd, 1942. Mr. McPherson may think it advisable for us to inform the New Spanish Consul of our intentions. Please ascertain his wishes.

Mr. Field should be appointed Liquidator under Regulation 15 regardless of the letter from the Camp Commandant on the 29th December, 1942 as follows:

"The a/n internee was paraded as he states as follows:
Will you please defer the sale of this equipment a little longer?
I hope to be able to make some satisfactory arrangement with regards to its disposal."

I have prepared a Liquidation Order and attach same for signature of Mr. McPherson. The liabilities of the estate will be far in excess of the assets - (see our own review of the file dated January 13, 1943). We should inform Mr. McPherson about the internee's objections as recorded in the Camp Commandant's letter but doubt if Mr. McPherson will be influenced and grant further extension.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 16th instant in which you advise that Dr. Horie is about to be released from the Angler Internment Camp and will take up a medical position in the logging camps in North West Ontario.

On December 20th 1941 Messrs. P.S. Ross & Sons were delegated by the Custodian to control and deal with the property of the above. A statement of his affairs was prepared and the liabilities considerably exceeded the assets.

The house at which Dr. Horie resided was being purchased on an option basis but the payments made actually represented a rental value and Dr. Horie signed a quit claim deed to this property.

His automobile was also returned to the Vendors with the consent of Dr. Horie in settlement of the outstanding liability on the same.

In regard to Dr. Horie's surgical equipment, there was an unpaid balance on the X-ray machine. Enquiries were made as to the possibility of Dr. Horie being able to practice in the Internment camps and receive a remuneration which could be used towards the satisfaction of his debts. Arrangements along these lines were unable to be made and on February 18th 1943 Mr. Frederick Field of the firm of Messrs. P.S. Ross & Sons, was appointed under the Consolidated Regulations to wind up and liquidate the property and affairs of Dr. Horie.

Subsequently the surgical equipment and office furniture were advertised for sale by tender and were also independently appraised. Several tenders were received and the highest bids were considered satisfactory and were accepted. Payment in full has been received and the equipment delivered to the respective purchasers.

Dr. C. George Hori interviewed Mr. Pammett at Sloan City in July and asked that we do everything possible to secure the return of his equipment which was seized at the time of internment, in order that he can practise in Northern Ontario more efficiently among the Japanese employed by the Pigeon Timber Company. For your information, it might be noted that Dr. Hori has been granted a temporary licence to practise in Ontario by the Ontario College of Physicians and Surgeons.

We have discussed this matter with Mr. McPherson of the Custodian's Branch, who advises that Dr. Hori was insolvent when interned and that after long negotiations with his creditors, his equipment was finally advertised and sold; the proceeds being used to liquidate his liabilities.

Dr. Hori is also anxious to get his case histories, text books, and lecture notes, however, and as these would not have any sale value, it is presumed that they are still in the possession of the Custodian's Branch at Vancouver. I would be obliged, therefore, if you would contact Mr. F.G. 



The abovementioned person is of Japanese extraction and formerly resided at 427 Hastings St., Vancouver.

Pursuant to the consolidated regulations respecting trading with the enemy and the defence of Canada regulations, he was, I believe, treated as an enemy alien, and all his goods and assets were confiscated.

George Hori is and was by occupation, a physician and surgeon and among the assets confiscated, were a motor car and surgical instruments, a microscope etc. which it is estimated amounted to over \$1,000.00 in value.

The assets of Dr. Hori were vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property, no doubt the Custodian assumed responsibility for the debts of Dr. Hori, at least up to the amount of the assets.

Dr. Hori subsequently came to Montreal where he is at present a surgeon on the staff of St. Mary's Hospital, and is highly esteemed by the officials of

this hospital. He has recently been sued by the W.F. Prior Company Inc. for merchandise purchased on February 26th, 1941 and the matter has been handed to me by Dr. Hori who requested me to communicate with yourself. I note that the W.F. Prior Company Inc. has filed a claim against the estate of Dr. Hori and has already received a dividend. *50.53 - 2570 Dividend*

Would you kindly let me know if it would be possible to obtain an account of the assets of Dr. Hori, and whether the action of the W.F. Prior Company Inc. should be forwarded to the Custodian of Enemy Property?



I regret very much that on reference to Dr. Hori's file your letter of August 10th has remained unanswered. Your letter was to be referred to a member of our staff and his removal to Ottawa was the cause of your letter being overlooked.

In regard to the information which you ask for, the following may be of service:

At the time of Dr. Hori's internment his affairs were placed in the hands of a Controller with powers of liquidation. The Controller's Report includes the attached Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements.

Dr. Hori will be aware that his De Soto car was released to the Finance Company and also that he signed a Quit Claim for the house in which he resided.

His 50% interest in a property at 927 East Georgia Street netted the sum of \$325.- and this amount you will notice is shown in the Statement of Cash receipts.

While we have a long list of Accounts Receivable totalling \$2,698.- only \$301.- has been collected and collection of the balance is very doubtful. The list of claims filed is also attached.

In regard to the W.F. Prior Co. Incorporated to which you refer. You will notice that their claim filed with the Liquidator was for \$62.14. A dividend of 25% has been paid on this and a further 14¢ on the dollar will be paid in the very near future. After payment of this 14¢ dividend there will only remain a small balance in the hands of the Liquidator and

A copy of your letter dated April 1st addressed to the Custodian at Ottawa has been forwarded to this office for attention by Mr. K. W. Wright, Counsel to the Custodian. I am pleased to supply the following information:

Dr. Hori's affairs at the time he was interned were placed in the hands of a Controller with powers of liquidation. The Controller's report includes the attached Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements.

You will notice from this that a 25% dividend has already been paid and that there is a balance of \$935.08. The Controller has now recommended a further distribution of 14¢ on the dollar and this distribution will be made in the near future. A small balance will still remain but the fees in connection with the control and liquidation will need to be taken care of.

Among the assets seized was a 1938 De Soto automobile, on which there was a balance owing to the Finance Co., and as no offer was received sufficient to cover this liability, arrangements were finally made for the Finance Co. to accept the car in payment of the balance due. Approval of this arrangement was made by Dr. Hori.





I acknowledge receipt of yours of the 30th ult. re the above mentioned.

I would point out that if Dr. Hori takes action he must have the permission of the Custodian of Enemy Property because according to Consolidated Regulations Respecting Trading With The Enemy, the Custodian of Enemy Property and various Controllers appointed by him have the authority of a Liquidator under the Winding Up Act.

It is not sufficient that the Custodian or the Controller has no objections but he must officially have given his permission for Dr. Hori to take proceedings. I would suggest that possibly the most convenient method would be for the Custodian or the Controller to announce in the Canada Official Gazette that Dr. Hori has been discharged from the operation of the Consolidated Regulations Respecting Trading With the Enemy and all disabilities thereunder. Would you kindly let me know your opinion on this matter? I have duly noted the list of debtors and schedule of accounts enclosed with yours of the 30th ult. I note that against the name of the various debtors appear their respective addresses. Would you kindly let me know if these are the correct addresses, if not, would it be possible to ascertain their correct addresses. It is my intention as attorney for Dr. Hori to give the matter to an attorney in British Columbia for legal action against the respective debtors and for that reason I would ask the permission of the Custodian to proceed, and such information as you may be able to give me concerning the addresses of these debtors.



According to the foregoing case which was decided both by the Superior Court and Court of King's Bench, the only way an Enemy Alien can sue for his own debts and property is after he has been released by the Secretary of State and regains exercise of his rights. If I am wrong, would you kindly inform me.
