

1. The above named is at present in custody in the Canadian Immigration Detention Sheds in Vancouver having been arrested as an alien enemy. He is 55 years old and unmarried. He is employed as a farm labourer in the Vernon District. He was interviewed by the writer on Jan. 5th, 1941 in an effort to obtain information which might prove of assistance to the Custodian of Enemy Alien Property in the administration of his affairs.
