GENERAL SUMMARY

This man signed a "J" Card on March 30, 1942 (card now on case file of his personal property claim, which was withdrawn at hearing). He was evacuated on October 19, 1942.

Some personal effects of this man or his wife were stored at Lindsay's Cartage. All appear to have been shipped.

For details of personal property see memorandum of June 29, 1945 and memorandum of February 16, 1948.

The items listed in claim had not been reported to Custodian, nor found by Custodian. The claim was withdrawn at hearing.

There is no record of anything in this file that requires further attention.

MEMORANDUM

This man declared no personal property to this office when he registered on March 30th, 1942. He was evacuated to Slocan on October 19th, 1942. He put in a claim against this office through the B. C. Security Commission for wages for work done as an interpreter at Hastings Park during the period March 24th to April 10th. However, as this man was not hired by this office and as the B. C. Security Commission, upon this advice, did not follow the matter further, this claim may be ignored.

There was a note for \$200.00 against this man in favor of Mr. R. G. Johnston of the Inverness Cannery. Mr. Johnston died and the note was transferred to his widow. The final payment of \$50.00 was made through this office to Mrs. Johnston and the Japanese is taking up the matter direct with her regarding the present position.

On November 16th, 1942, we received a Custodian Release for the shipment of the following.

- 1 Sewing machine
- 1 Fibre box (kitchen utensils and clothing)
- 2 Wooden boxes (kitchen utensils and clothing)

On December 16th, 1942, we were advised by Messrs. Lindsay's Cartage that they held the above articles in storage, charges being \$3.50. On January 15th, 1943, Sadao Suga applied for shipment of these effects. This was done and the charges paid by Messrs. M. M. Stephens Company of Prince Rupert, being the agents for this Japanese. Letter acknowledging receipt of this payment appears on file dated April 7th, 1943. This concludes all transactions on this man's behalf and the file may now be closed.

I certify this to be a true statement of affairs as disclosed by the file.
