Dear Sir:

I received your letter of the 23 instant. According to the letter claims were filed through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee; I was not aware of such actions were being taken, and was not informed of such, this I believe was due to my early evacuation to the east.

The boat I referred to was a remodelled sail boat with drum installations, white hull and cabins, the pilot house being square. The length of the boat was around 29 feet in length with 8 feet beam, powered with a six horse power Easthope Marine Engine.

This boat did not have any Naval Registration number but had a fishing license number of my father T.K. (The number I have

(forgotter). The vessel was owned by me. I sold it to the Nelson Brothers Fishery, who operated a cannery in Prince Rupert.

The Naval Department in charge of the impounding of fishing vessels took my name and registration number and also the markings on the boat, surely they can confirm this statement.

As to witnesses of my being on this trip, could you kindly contact Mr. Minoru Sakamoto, and Mr. J. Matsushita now residing in Sooke B.C., who were also on this trip. If further witnesses are necessary I will gladly supply them.
