

at 302 Heatley Ave., Vancouver. On February 16, 1945 we advised her that our representatives were unable to locate the chattels declared and assumed that she had sold them subsequent to her registration. We did not receive a reply from her.

WAR SAVING

CERTIFICATES: She declared four \$5.00 War Saving Certificates in possession of Michiko MIYAGAWA, her daughter. This did not come under control of the Custodian.

BANK

ACCOUNT: Mrs. MIYAGAWA declared a joint savings account of \$200.00 with Michiko MIYAGAWA in the Bank of Montreal. This did not come under control of the Custodian.

LIFE

INSURANCE: She declared a \$1,000.00 policy with the Crown Life Insurance Co., on the life of George MIYAGAWA, her son. Cash benefit under policy No. 170,229 amounting to \$17.93 was received from the Crown Life Insurance Co. on November 10, 1944, and credited to Int. File 203, the husband, Heitaro MIYAGAWA. On January 3, 1945, we remitted to the Crown Life Insurance Co. \$5.03. Receipts and payments under this policy are carried on the file of husband Heitaro MIYAGAWA, Int. File 203, as there was not, at any time, any credit balance on the file of Mrs. Miyagawa.

Re: Crown Life Policy No. 170229

We acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 17th and note by that, that you request the amount of the dividend, \$17.93, be sent to your husband at the internment camp.

We would ask you kindly to refer again to our letter to you of August 9th with the Crown Life letter of July 28th attached; and I think it is stated clearly there, that the form requested by the insurance company and signed by your husband and yourself directed them to apply the dividend of \$17.93 to the account of the policy loan indebtedness in connection with the above numbered policy.

I think you must misunderstand the situation. If this form you signed is sent to the insurance company the money will be applied to the policy and will not be payable by them in cash; and that is, I understand, the desire expressed by your husband.

If, on the other hand, you and your husband would prefer to have the \$17.93 in cash, then this form you signed should not be sent to the insurance company; but instead, we should apply to them to pay the dividend in cash.

I think you had better drop a line to your husband and make up your minds which you wish to do. In the meantime, I will hold the form that you and your husband signed on file until I hear from you in this connection.
