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

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

March 4, 1946.

Re: Yuriko (Mrs. Yoshimitsu) SASAKI, Reg. No. 11095

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942, in which she stated that she owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

On May 25, 1942, she signed a Custodian release for household effects and foodstuffs which had been declared by her husband, Yoshimitsu SASAKI, file 1016. It would appear from the file of her husband and father-in-law, file 11489, that all the foodstuffs belonging to this woman, her husband and her parents-in-law were accounted for with the exception of a tub of Japanese sauce and a 100 lb. sack of rice.

On December 1, 1942, and on September 21, 1942 we wrote this woman and the other members of this SASAKI family, asking them to send us a list of all the items they had left behind at the cannery. The reply which we received from this family referred only to foodstuffs and none of the four files concerned give accurate information in regard to household articles. It is not clear, therefore, whether all the household effects belonging to these people have been stolen, with the exception of the tool box and bed and spring which were sold and the proceeds credited to the account of this woman's husband. It would appear that most of their household effects were left in their home and that this building was thoroughly ransacked.

This file reveals no evidence of any other property of any kind belonging to this woman.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

My letter of September 21st sets out the position at that date fairly completely.

In addition, there were at that date at the North Pacific Cannery belonging to Sajiro Sasaki,

- 1 Sewing machine (crated)
- 1 Box
- 1 Mattress
- 1 Bedstead and springs

The two first items have now been shipped.

From Sajiro Sasaki's letter of March 29th, it would appear that shortages claimed in his of December 9th have now been reduced to one 100 lb. sack of rice and one tub of sauce. I will request Mr. Harris to look into this when the North Pacific Cannery opens up this summer.
