

GENERAL MEMORANDUM

Re: Toshio BANDO, Reg. 02421

Files 7799, 9523, 3764 and 14723, being the files of Mr. & Mrs. Tomiso BANDO, Eiso BANDO and Yoshio BANDO, respectively, have been reviewed. These are the parents and brothers of Toshio BANDO.

In their declarations to the Custodian, these persons declared no property of any kind, and at no time has any of them written to this office since their evacuation inquiring about any property.

While the property dealt with in this file would appear to have been property belonging to the parents or to the family jointly, because of the nature of the articles, which were household effects, books and clothing, there is nothing on the files of the other members of this family to indicate any interest in this property.

Because of the foregoing and because the funds derived from the sale of the chattels remaining after shipment of effects to Toshio BANDO, at Slocan, amounted to only \$19.02, it has been assumed that no one other than Toshio BANDO has any interest in these chattels.

CHattel SUMMARY

Re: Toshio BANDO, Reg. 00748

This man, who was evacuated on April 9, 1942, signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 18, 1942. In his declaration he reported ownership of only one CCM bicycle, which was stored at his home. This bicycle, according to his letter of October 23, 1942, was disposed of by himself.

On July 2, 1943, this man reported a quantity of household effects, clothing and another CCM bicycle, which he stated were stored in the basement of the Continental Daily News, 213 E. Cordova. These chattels he stated were marked with his name, and had been left at the Continental Daily News by his father who had been under the impression that Toshio had declared these.

In Custodian Release form, dated January 10, 1944, Toshio BANDO asked that certain of his chattels be shipped to him at Slocan, and the articles shown as shipped on the Chattels Schedule were sent to him by Mr. A. H. Young, who held the key to the building where the goods were stored. This shipment was handled through the B. C. Security Commission. At the time of shipment, according to information on file, one box of chinaware, 2 paper boxes of books, and a wicker trunk of clothing could not be found.

On January 10, 1944, Toshio BANDO sent this office a list of articles which were to be sold for him, and in the Spring of 1945 all chattels stored at the Continental Daily News were removed to Custodian warehouse, where all chattels marked with the name of Toshio BANDO which were found to be saleable were sold, June 20, 1945. The net proceeds of this sale in the amount of \$19.02 were credited to the account of Toshio BANDO.

The articles of which there was no record, as shown on the Schedule, could not be found when the Custodian's representatives removed the chattels to the warehouse. As chattels belonging to a number of persons were stored at the Continental Daily News, and these were not always marked with the owner's name, identification was difficult. The keys to the building were not in the Custodian's possession until the summer of 1944, and prior to that time various shipments of effects had been made by others than Custodian representatives, therefore we have no knowledge of what happened to certain of this man's effects, we know only that these were not removed by us from the Continental Daily News.

Between the date of evacuation and the date we removed the chattels, shipments were made by Mr. IWASAKI on his visit to Vancouver and also by Mr. A. H. Young, who held the keys to this building. I have made this quite clear to Mr. Young, who agrees, and mentioned that he had written to Mr. IWASAKI disclaiming responsibility for any chattels that may or may not have been left stored in this building.

Dear Sir:

In accordance with your request, we enclose Custodian cheque in the amount of \$39.89, representing all funds standing to the credit of your account with this office.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that when you signed your declaration to the Custodian you stated that you owned one CCM bicycle. On October 23, 1942, you informed this office that you had disposed of this bicycle yourself.

In July, 1943, you reported a quantity of chattels, and stated that these had been stored at the Continental Daily News building by your father. On January 10, 1944, you asked that certain items be sent to you at Slocan, and we understand that Mr. A. H. Young and the British Columbia Security Commission shipped to you the articles requested, with the exception of one box of chinaware, two paper boxes of books and a wicker trunk of clothing which could not be located.

In January, 1944, you asked that certain articles be sold on your behalf, and on June 20, 1945, all saleable articles found marked with your name were sold at auction, and the net proceeds of \$19.02 were credited to your account.

Your camera was mailed to you on July 23, 1945, and the postage of 13 cents charged to your account.

Your radio was sold, and the net proceeds of this sale in the amount of \$21.00 credited to your account.

It would appear that we have accounted for all property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the enclosed cheque, we attach a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

Dear Sir:

We have for acknowledgment your letter of the 13th instant regarding your articles missing from the Tairiku Nippo Sha building. We did not have the key to that building until the property was sold, when we had to remove the remaining chattels in order to give the new owners possession of the building. We explained to Mr. A. H. Young that we would not accept any responsibility for chattels not left in our care.

Mr. Iwasaki on his visit to Vancouver marked the names of the owners on the goods left in that building, so we are therefore at a loss to understand why anything should be missing unless it was shipped to the owners. We might further point out that we were not advised of the bulk of your goods until more than a year after your declaration was made to the Custodian.

We regret our inability to assist you in this respect.
