



HEADQUARTERS

1. Acting on instructions of Sgt. Barnes, J.K., i/o Intelligence Section, on the 2nd instant, the captionally named Japanese National was taken into custody under authority of the Defence of Canada Regulations.

SUB-DIVISION

2. On the 3rd instant this prisoner was handed over to the Military Detail at the Immigration Detention Shed for internment, a receipt being taken for the subject's living body and effects, which is held on file at this point.

DETACHMENT

3. Certificate of Parole No. 152036 was surrendered for cancellation.

4. This prisoner stated that he was married his wife being Mrs. Shina Nakamura, of 119 Main St., Vancouver.

5. He further stated that his assets consisted of a \$1000 life insurance policy with the Astor Life Insurance Co., and furniture in the house occupied by his wife.

GENERAL SUMMARY

March 17, 1949

Interned - March 12, 1942

Released - July 10, 1946

Repatriated - October 2, 1946.

TREASURY CLAIM: \$189.05

April 1, 1942 this man declared furniture and other personal chattels to value of \$1,200.00. Did not state where goods were left.

June 22, 1942 he asked that these goods be left at 119 Main Street, Vancouver, his former address.

February 16, 1946, Mr. G.B. Spain and Mr. Wills visited 119 Main Street in search for chattels. They reported this to be a low grade flophouse and could find no trace of any property of Mr. Mori there.

Mori reported a Sun Life policy - this policy was not turned in to Custodian.

The sum of \$5 cents balance in Japan & Canada Trust Co. account was credited to this man's account, and was released to Treasury Department March 5, 1947.

No funds or property of this man remain under Custodian's control.
