Dear Sir:

Your letter of August 14th was the first indication we had that you owned a camera. Neither yourself nor Kazumi Maede declared ownership of such an article when registering with the Custodian, and your names are not shown on list of owners of cameras surrendered to the Police.

However, if you will send us the receipt received when the camera was surrendered (or a copy of the receipt, if you do not wish to send the receipt) we shall investigate the matter and endeavour to locate your camera.

Cameras are being released to owners residing outside the Interior Housing Settlements. If you will send us the receipt for your camera, together with letter from your brother Kazumi (or the person who is shown as owner on the receipt, if it is someone other than your brother Kazumi), authorizing us to ship the camera to you, we will take up with the British Columbia Security Commission the question of shipment.

Shipments of cameras are made charges C.O.D.

It would be necessary to supply the actual receipt when asking for shipment, although a copy would be sufficient to enable us to check with the police.
