
We have today received a letter from the Department of The Secretary of State, Ottawa informing us that they have been advised by Internment Operations that the above named Prisoner of War is to be returned to Japan at an early date. The letter continues "An application will be made for funds and I believe you are holding English currency and that the Foreign Exchange Control Board refused permission to convert funds a few months ago. When the request is made will you be good enough to apply again as the Board may be willing to reverse their ruling in view of his repatriation."

For your guidance we are sending you herewith copy of a letter received from your Department in Ottawa in June last in answer to our letter to Bank of Canada requesting conversion of £ 3.1.9 taken from the man at the Internment Camp. The other £ 20.- was received separately.

Taking into consideration the fact that this man is being repatriated to Japan, and the provisions of Order in Council P.C. 7355, Section 6, Sub-Sec. 1 will you please reconsider the ruling given in the attached letter and give us authority to convert the £23.1.9 into Canadian funds so that we may be able to hand over to The Department of Labour all the assets of IKEDA when the matter of providing him with Yen receipts comes to their attention.

Thanking you in advance for your co-operation in this matter.


Re: Motoichi IKEDA, PWA 405

Please refer to your letter of 25th February, 1946. He held here in English currency £23.1s.9d and have now received from the Foreign Exchange Control Board their cheque for \$101.89 in exchange for the 23 £1 sterling notes. The 1s-6d in silver we sold to the Bank here for 30¢ and the 3 English pennies are still attached to the file as we can not do anything with them.

The account now shows a credit balance of \$183.19 being the above two amounts plus the original amount standing to his credit of \$81.00 received from the Ministry of War Transport in payment of his wages.

So far as we can see there remains nothing more to be done in the matter until application for funds for his repatriation is made.

J.405 IKEDA, Motoichi

The m/n Japanese who is held on behalf of the Newfoundland Government as an enemy Merchant Seaman and therefore to whom the regulations covering the proposed repatriation of Japanese nationals commonly resident in Canada do not apply, is to be repatriated to Japan under special arrangements with the first party leaving Angler.

2. Reference to this man's file reveals that the Custodian is holding £3;1s;9d in British currency on his behalf. To date it has been impossible to convert this sum into Canadian funds but it is hoped, however, that the difficulty may now be overcome.

3. May Ikeda be instructed to write to the Custodian and request that his funds held by that Official may be converted to Canadian Currency and transferred to him for deposit in his trust account at your camp or that he may be given the proceeds of this amount in Japanese funds at the time of his departure to Japan.

4. May this matter be treated as urgent, please, in order to avoid complications when the draft is moved.
