GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 449 (Int) Chozo TAKAHASHI, Dec'd. Reg

Reg. No. 01563

Choso TakaHaSHI died at Winnipeg, Manitoba while en route to internment camp on May 23, 1942. He is survived by his widow, Suga, file #13178; three sons, Hideo, Internee file #522, Akira, Internee file #666, and Toshio, file #13177; and four daughters, Kiyoko, file #13156, Kamuko, file #13157, and Fumiko and Haruko, minors.

The deceased made no declaration to the Custodian but it is revealed on the file that he had insurance policies in the Equitable Life Insurance Company and the London Scottish Corporation Ltd. Permission was given to the companies to pay the benefits direct to the widow who was the beneficiary under both policies. The sum of \$30.21 was received from the Internment Camp on November 9, 1942, and credited to the account of the deceased. All personal effects which Takahashi had in his possession at the time of his death were turned over to the widow. Chattels left at the home of the deceased, about which the widow inquires in her letter of October 13, 1945, were removed and sold at suction for a net amount of \$1.38. The widow was so advised on February 28, 1946, and the sum was credited to her account. The amount of 41¢ was received from the B. C. Electric, being refund of security deposit, and was credited to the account of the deceased.

A claim was filed against the deceased by the Provincial Mental Hospital. They were asked by this office to advise us of the correct amount of the claim and, on April 17, 1944, they advised that the account had been paid in full by the B. C. Security Commission. The B. C. Security Commission then filed a claim for \$16.20 to cover this bill. Custodian cheque in this amount was forwarded to the B. C. Security Commission on April 27, 1944. A claim for \$6.00 was filed by Dr. M. Uchida but this was later withdrawn.

On October 23, 1945, Custodian cheque in the amount of \$14.01 was sent to Suga Takahashi, being all funds to the credit of the deceased at that time. On February 13, 1946, a further cheque for 41¢ was forwarded to the widow, being B. C. Electric refund credited to the account of the deceased after all funds on hand had been remitted.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.
