PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. XI 466

This man was an industry worker, living with his mother, Ito HORI - file 12649, at 1661 West 2nd Ave., Vancouver. He signed his declaration to the Custodian on April 4, 1942, and was interned April 21st, 1942.

Tadao HORI declared a number of chattels, April 4, 1942, which he left with his mother at 1661 West 2nd Ave. It would appear from her file (12649) that she disposed of these effects prior to her evacuation. This file XI 466 discloses no more information regarding his household effects.

On April 4, 1942 Tadao HORI declared an insurance policy - \$250.00 - Prudential Life Insurance. The Prudential Life Insurance Co. submitted particulars of his policy no. 104323244 for \$215.00, as the only one they had written for this man. His mother brought this policy into the office. It is on file, and will be returned to Tadao Hori, today.

This file discloses no other property.

CHATEL SUMMARY

November 29, 1947.

Re: HORI, Tadao,
Reg. No. 06955.

Tadao HORI, an industry worker, living with his mother, Ito HORI - file 12649, at 1661 West 2nd Ave., Vancouver, B.C., signed his declaration to the Custodian on April 4th, 1942 and was interned April 21st, 1942.

He declared 1 Westinghouse Washing Machine, 1 Singer Treadle Sewing Machine, 1 kitchen range stove, 4 beds, 1 parlor coal stove, 1 man's bicycle, general furniture, kitchen utensils, all left at 1661 West 2nd Ave., Vancouver, B.C. His file reveals no disposition of these chattels, but on the file of his mother, there is a memo dated October 13th, 1942 to the effect that

'On October 11th Mrs. Hori was still in possession. She has sold the majority of her chattels, and if there is anything left requiring our protection at the time of her evacuation she will advise us.'

She was evacuated on October 28, 1942, and it would seem that she had sold all the effects in their apartment, including those of Tadao HORI, as the file reveals no further evidence of chattels.

(On December 11, 1942, a number of chattels were moved from 1661 West 2nd Ave. to Custodian Storehouse at 604 Cordova, and these were all identified as possessions of the landlord, Mr. Fusajiro OBAYASHI, File 11749 (wife's file 12296). These belongings were moved because, according to memo of March 16, on File 12296, 1661 was condemned by the City authorities and the property was empty between the end of October and the end of November and had been ransacked by thieves.)

This file reveals no other chattels of any kind.

Dear Sir:

Your letter addressed to Mr. Mann, Superintendent of our Vancouver Branch Office, has been referred to the Home Office for attention. Premiums under the following policies were last paid for the week of March 30, 1942. When premium payments were discontinued, the insurance protection was continued in accordance with the Extended Insurance provision contained in the policies. The periods of protection will not expire until the dates indicated. Should death occur during the periods of protection, the amounts of insurance will become payable in full. Should the insured under the first five policies survive the extended period, the insurance protection would terminate and the remaining values of the policies would become payable in cash. The last two policies were issued on the Life plan and do not provide for such cash payments at the expiration of the insurance protection.
