PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File 472

March 18, 1946.

Re: Matairo IKEGAMI, Reg. No. 10915

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 23, 1942. He was evacuated from the Protected Area on September 28, 1942.

In his declaration this man reported 8 boxes containing tools, gas stove, dishes, foodstuffs, gramophone, 2 trunks, 2 nets and fishing tackle, all left in the care of Claxton Cannery, Skeena River. The inventory taken by Mr. Dave Smith when he visited Claxton in the summer of 1942 shows the chattels of this man as a bed, 2 trunks, 9 boxes, a gramophone, wash tub containing utensils and a 7-ft. saw.

It would appear that in October, 1942, 3 wooden boxes and the 2 trunks were shipped to IKEGAMI. On April 10, 1942, this office handed to IKEGAMI a B.C. Packers Ltd. cheque for \$98.25 representing the purchase price of 1 Coho net at \$25.00, 1 Spring net at \$35.00 and 1 Gurdy at \$40.00, less \$1.75 deducted to cover insurance which B.C. Packers Ltd. carried on the fishing gear belonging to IKEGAMI. The chattels remaining at Claxton Cannery identified as the property of this man were sold at auction in July, 1945, for the net sum of \$50.59. The chattels sold were mainly small articles, dishes, clothing, cooking utensils which were removed from boxes. The larger items were a child's high chair, phonograph, gas stove and chest of drawers. Neither the chest of drawers nor the child's high chair were declared. The net proceeds from the auction sale were credited to the account of this man. The bed and saw which Mr. Dave Smith inventoried did not appear among the articles sold.

The radio which IKEGAMI surrendered to Naval Service early in 1942 was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$22.49 which has been credited to the account of IKEGAMI. The receipt for this radio is on file and the funds are free. The picture album surrendered at the time that the radio was turned in has been returned to IKEGAMI.

This file reveals no other property.

Dear Sir:

Your file with this office has been reviewed and it is noted that, in your declaration to the Custodian you reported two fishing nets and other fishing tackle at Claxton Cannery. On April 10, 1942, this office handed to you British Columbia Packers Ltd. cheque for \$98.25, representing payment in full for a Schoe net, a Spring net and a gurdy purchased from you, less the sum of \$1.75 to cover the cost of insurance which the company had placed on your goods.

You declared eight boxes, containing dishes, clothing, foodstuffs, tools, gas-stove and a gramophone, and two trunks all at Claxton Cannery. In November, 1942, two trunks and three boxes were shipped to you. All saleable articles remaining at Claxton Cannery in June, 1945, were removed to Prince Rupert where these were sold at public auction. The net proceeds from the sale of items identified as your property were \$50.59, which were credited to your account.

The radio, which you surrendered, was sold for the net sum of \$22.49, which has been placed to the credit of your account.

The picture album, surrendered with the radio, has been shipped to you. The cost of shipping was 16 cents, which was charged to your account.

The account of Dr. J. A. Smith for \$150.00, which you have acknowledged to be correct, is being settled in full for the sum of \$50.00, Dr. Smith having agreed to accept this sum in full settlement.

This leaves in your account the sum of \$22.42, and Custodian cheque for this amount is enclosed herewith.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and, in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
