We have your letter of August 11th with regard to the above named person and would advise that any property in the way of permanent buildings left by the Japanese are deemed to be property of British Columbia Packers Limited and would again refer you to our letter of July 9th.

To the best of our knowledge, no arrangement was made that this man would have rent free for fifteen or twenty years provided he repaired any boats. To the best of our knowledge no Company boats were ever repaired at Bella Bella as we have our own shipyards at Celtic in Vancouver which repairs Company owned boats and in quite a number of instances ~~at~~ gillnet boats. No operation has been carried on at Bella Bella for some years and no boats of the Company were therefore at this plant.

Attention Mr. Wright.

We have your instructions that in several instances a Japanese has built upon the land of another, the registered owner, on the terms that the Japanese would have the right to occupy the house so long as he made some monthly or periodical payment in kind, such as a fish or a loaf, and that when the Japanese left the house it was to be the property of the third person, the owner of the land. You have inquired as to the interest of the Custodian under such circumstances. In our opinion the Japanese had no interest in the land to which the Custodian could succeed; it could not be a freehold interest because there was no obligation, or intention of conveying any interest in any part of the land to the Japanese. On the contrary the intention was that the house should remain part of the land and at some time revert to the owner. It could not be a lease as it is for an indefinite term and not made definite at the inception. These facts therefore exclude a possessory interest in the land such as estate or leasehold interest. It follows that the Japanese had a bare licence, that is a licence to occupy the land, no doubt with his family but subject to the two limitations expressed :-

1. Periodic payments.
2. The cesser of the licence, when the Japanese left.

The Japanese has left, therefore his licence is terminated. In such event there appears to be no

right to which you could have succeeded. It might be otherwise if there was a perpetual licence, such as in Plimmer v. Wellington Corporation, 1884 - 53 L.J. P. C. 105, but this licence could not be perpetual or irrevocable by reason of the limitation provided in the express terms.

Your letter received from our plant at Bella Bella regarding the above named Japanese and we would like to advise as follows:

Any buildings built on the property of this Company whether they were built by Japanese or not have been deemed the Property of the Company when the previous owner leaves same. We never charged any rent or drew up any lease whatsoever with the former owners and therefore do not feel responsible for their equipment or belongings. However we have watchmen at the different plants and if you would like to arrange a meeting with the writer of the letter we will endeavour to make some arrangements for your Department to have same looked over by our watchman and a full report given of same. All of our plants have been advised that under no circumstances must they sign or acknowledge for receipt of Japanese goods unless they are advised so by this office. An interview might clear up a lot of differences regarding evacuated Japanese equipment.

GENERAL SUMMARY

This 51-year old Japanese-National Boat builder from Bella Bella, B. C., signed a Custodian "JP" declaration form on the 20th March, 1942. He was interned on April 24th, 1942, and released from Internment on July 10th, 1946. He was single at date of internment.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: None. See "Personal Property" below for Messuage Tenure interest in Boat House.

Personal Property: This evacuee declared ownership of the following buildings, etc., on land owned by B. C. Packers Ltd., at Bella Bella:

One House (18' x 22')	\$ 700.00
Bath House (10' x 12') with Oil Boiler	\$ 300.00
One Shipyards (37' x 52')	\$2500.00
Dry Dock (10' x 12')	\$3500.00
Plank Road (3'6" x 200')	\$ 400.00
Marine railway	\$1300.00

The Company is quoted (See memo dated Mar. 29/43) as describing the values indicated by declarant as "obviously faked and ridiculous". On July 9th, 1942, the Company writes "any buildings built on the property of this Company whether they were built by Japanese or not have been deemed the property of the Company when the previous owner leaves same. We never charged any rent or drew up any lease whatsoever with the former owners.....".

The values placed on household and personal effects would appear to have had similar liberal treatment. See Chattels Schedule for particulars of items.

Specified Articles: None.

Bills Receivable: Declarant claimed outstanding accounts for carpentry amounting to \$500.00 but did not know names of his debtors.

Bonds, Shares, etc.: A Victory Bond (\$50.00) left in the custody of the Post Master at Bella Bella was obtained from the latter (June 9/42) together with a War Savings Certificate (\$5.00). War Savings Certificates ("approx. \$100.00") declared to be in owner's possession were sent in to this office (June 15/42) from Petasawa Internment Camp. These Certificates (1 @ \$50.00 and 9 @ \$5.00) were redeemed (Feb. 2/43) and proceeds credited to this account in the sum of \$77.04.

Bank Accounts: A balance of \$200.00 (approx.) declared to be in an account with the Main Street, Vancouver, branch of the Royal Bank of Canada was advised by the latter (June 4/42) to have been paid out in the sum of \$203.97, and account closed.


