Please note that Kijuro John SHIKATANI, Reg. No. 11127, File 486, has filed with the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, a claim for recovery of expenses incurred by him when he brought the vessel "Coronation" from Prince Rupert in December, 1941. SHIKATANI had been employed by Hirokichi YAMAHAKA, owner of the vessel, to whom the sum of \$50.25 was credited as refund of these expenses.

Hold the sum of \$50.25 in the account of Hirokichi YAMAHAKA until we hear further from SHIKATANI or YAMAHAKA.

Dear Sir

I have ~~already~~ ^{Bill} written to the Department of Labour (Japanese Division) about my claim for the trip aboard the boat 'Coronation' owned by Mr H K Yamazaki while I was employed in his grocery store from Prince Rupert B.C. to Steneston B.C. when it was towed down there by the navy just after the outbreak of the war who in turn advised me to write to you.

As I have already stated to the Dept of Labour, here is the list of expenditure & wages lost during my trip.

Wages lost	\$40.00
Fare back to Prince Rupert aboard C.P.R. Liner	\$26.00
Cost for new pair of pants, shoe & sweater	\$20.00
Expenditure in Vancouver, meals, rooms etc.	\$30.00
Cost of grub on trip	\$15.00
TOTAL	\$131.00

I hope you will consider this matter thoroughly and answer me as soon as possible.

Re: Hirokichi YAMANAKA - Reg. No. 10419.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 7th instant filing a claim for \$131.00, said to be travelling expenses incurred in connection with delivery of the vessel "Coronation" from Prince Rupert to Steveston.

Our records show that all claims for the refund of such expenses were filed through the Fishermen's representative with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee. All claims so filed were forwarded to Ottawa and on receipt of payment, by this office, each claimant was credited with the amount appearing against his name in original statement.

In the case of the vessel, "Coronation", this amount was \$50.25, which was credited to the account of Mr. Yamanaka, the registered owner of the vessel. We have no other funds from which claims of this nature could be paid.
