PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

May 22, 1946.

Re: Isamu KONDO, Registration No. 09730

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942 in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

However, this man's account was credited with the amount of \$7.34 received from the Provincial Government as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941. This was remitted to KONDO on January 10, 1944.

This man sent in a radio receipt but as this radio was listed under the name of his father the proceeds of the sale of the radio were sent to his father, File No. 9052.

The Crown Life Insurance Co. reported that this man had a life insurance policy with that company. This did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
