PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 584

June 24, 1946.

Re: Ichitaro HAMASAKI, Reg. No. 10521

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942. He was evacuated on May 30, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a sewing machine, 2 boxes of kitchen utensils and chinaware, and a trunk stored with Hyde Transfer Co., Prince Rupert. These items were shipped to Ichitaro HAMASAKI on May 19, 1942.

On November 4, 1942, he requested shipment of 3 wooden boxes containing clothing, kitchen utensils and rubber boots at the Japanese Hall, Prince Rupert. The file does not indicate that any goods belonging to this man were stored at the Japanese Hall at Prince Rupert, nor does it indicate that goods were shipped as requested on the Release of November 4, 1942.

On August 3, 1944, 2 sleighs, a mattress and a cot bed were sold at auction at Prince Rupert. As these items were not declared by HAMASAKI the net proceeds from this sale, \$9.46, are being transferred to Suspense Account.

On August 3, 1945, Mr. B. J. Bacon, Bacon Fisheries, Prince Rupert, B. C. asked permission to ship to HAMASAKI a radio which they were holding for this man. (as security for a debt). We advised Mr. Bacon on August 8, 1945, that the Custodian had no objection to shipment being made. HAMASAKI was also informed that shipment could be arranged between Mr. Bacon and himself. We have no further information in regard to this radio.

The vessel "Ichitaro H" was being operated by this man, but the vessel licence was in the name of Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd. to whom HAMASAKI was indebted for the sum of \$350.00. Arrangements were made between HAMASAKI and Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd. on January 6, 1942 by which the vessel was taken over by Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd. and in February, 1942, the vessel was released from custody to Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd. We have no record of what payment, if any, was made to HAMASAKI in payment of his equity.

The wife of Ichitaro HAMASAKI declared no chattels or property of any kind.

We have received a letter from Mr. B. J. Bacon,
