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PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: ITO, Masa (Mrs. Ichisaburo)

Mrs. Masa Ito was the wife of a gardener employed by Mr. W. H. Malkin. She lived with her husband and six children in a four room bungalow at 3837 West 51st Ave., Vancouver. The owner of this house was Mrs. Burns, 3800 Block, West 51st Ave., Vancouver.

In her declaration made on April 4, 1942, Mrs. Ito listed "contents for four-room bungalow at 3837 West 51st Ave.", without giving any further details. She was evacuated September 4, 1942. On April 1, 1943, we wrote Mrs. Ito that our investigators were informed that she had sold or otherwise disposed of her chattels with the exception of one old dresser without drawers, one old stove and one homemade table in the basement and of practically no value. We asked her if these were all her chattels remaining in the restricted area of British Columbia requiring our protection. We had no reply. The file reveals no further action about these articles.

On April 4, 1942 Mrs. Ito stated that Rikizo Yoneyama (file no. 6976) owed her \$400.00 and asked our assistance in collecting it. On November 5, 1943 we advised her that we had submitted the above claim to Yoneyama for payment and that he had disputed it. He requested the address of Mr. and Mrs. Ito in order to write them personally. We gave him their address and advised Mr. and Mrs. Ito of our action. Again, on April 11, 1944, we forwarded the address of Yoneyama to Mr. and Mrs. Ito in case he had not written to them. We asked them to advise us if a settlement had been arrived at, but nothing was heard from them.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
