

INTERNAL GENERAL SUMMARY

This 47-year old Fisherman, a Naturalized Canadian, from Skeena River, signed a Custodian "JP" declaration form on the 23rd March, 1942.

His wife, Hara (File 596), signed a Custodian "JP" declaration form on the 23rd March, 1942.

They were evicted with their 3 children, on the 30th May, 1942.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

**Real Property:** This evictee declared he owned no Real Property but our records show him to be the registered owner, jointly with Yuji SHIMAZAKI (Reg. No. 11170, File 1398) of a parcel of land in an isolated position on the waterfront of the Skeena River (Certificate of Title No. 19803-1 a "Lot 304, Range 5, Coast District, said to contain 125 acres, more or less"). The assessed value (1945) of this property is \$765.00 (\$765.00 for Land, \$200.00 for Improvements). The property is unvalued at this date.

**Personal Property:** Chattels Schedule (to follow).

**Stocks and Bonds:** See Fishing Vessel Summary for particulars of the F.V., "Wiyako", sold (Mar. 27/42) for \$350.00.

**Other Receivables:** Transportation expenses in connection with delivery of Fishing Vessel, were recovered from the Government and credited to this account (Apr. 12/45) in the sum of \$5.00.

**War Savings Certificates:** War Savings Certificates (2 @ \$5.00 and 2 @ \$10.00) declared to be in his own possession, and so left.

**Bank Accounts:** None.

**Life Insurance:** None.

**Liabilities:** Declared \$100.00 owing to North Pacific Cannery Co. Ltd. on boat. Subsequently paid, when boat sold.

**Summary:** There is a credit balance of \$17.40 in this account at the present time.

1 wooden box (#10) (kitchen utensils)

1 box carpenter tools (#20)  
1 cross-cut saw (#34)

That is all I could find of the items listed on the bill."

Dear Sir & Madam:

Mr. Harris reports to us as follows:-

"We have a good deal of stuff still on hand at North Pacific such as bedsteads--boxes of household effects--gramophones and other odds and ends which we take this opportunity of reminding you are lying here entirely at the owner's risk. It would take an armed guard to prevent some pilfering and the rats maintain a steady attack on such things as mattresses for example. If it is possible to arrange for the shipment of this stuff to Vancouver we should appreciate it."

We suggest that if you require any of these goods, you apply in the usual way as per form letter 107 attached hereto. If you do not need any of them, please let us know promptly as we shall then move these items to safe storage for the duration.
