PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 20, 1942, the day before his evacuation.

In his declaration, he reported a quantity of furniture, a box of tools and a trunk at 456 1/2 Hastings Street East. In his letter of October 29, 1942, he informed us that all these articles had been taken away by himself.

He declared a sofa, 3 carpets, a box of small articles and a child's tricycle, left at Woodfibre. On May 7, 1942, we were informed by the B. C. Pulp and Paper Co. that the carpets, the box and the tricycle could not be found. On May 21, 1942, a shipment of chattels, belonging to this man, were received at 992 Powell Street from Woodfibre. In this shipment were the sofa, four bundles of chairs, a chest of drawers, bed-ends and spring. The bed-ends and spring were discarded as valueless, and the remaining articles were sold on July 25, 1944. Net proceeds, \$15.88 credited to his account.

HONDA declared \$128.00 worth of War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

He also declared \$100.00 in life insurance. This did not come under the control of the Custodian, but on December 9, 1943, at Honda's request, we paid from his funds the sum of \$30.00 to the North American Life Insurance Company to apply on outstanding premium. *See memo Sept 30/46*

The sum of \$6.48, refund of one per cent Wage Deductions for 1941, and \$24.42 refund of National Defence Tax have been credited to this account.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
