Dear Sir:

We enclose Custodian cheque for \$5.00 which represents the total amount standing to your credit with this office. This amount was received as refund of expenses incurred by you at the time of the impounding of your vessel "Maple Leaf".

In your declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942, you reported the "Maple Leaf" in custody at Prince Rupert, B.C. The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this boat was sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$715.25 were paid to you on March 31, 1942.

You reported a \$100.00 Victory Bond and \$50.00 in War Savings Certificates in your father's possession. You also reported a \$2,000.00 life insurance policy with the Manufacturers Life. These items did not come under the control of this office.

The R.C.M.P. handed to this office two cameras which had been surrendered by you. These cameras were shipped to you on September 22, 1945 and the cost of shipping, 15 cents, was charged to the account of your father.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge cheque we enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Kenichi HONKAWA, Registration No. 11117

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a fish packer, "Maple Leaf", in custody at Prince Rupert, B.C. The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this boat was sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$715.25 were paid to HONKAWA on March 31, 1942.

He reported a \$100.00 Victory Bond and \$50.00 in War Savings Certificates in the possession of his father. These did not come under the control of this office.

He reported a life insurance policy for \$2,000.00 with the Manufacturers Life. This did not come under the control of this office.

The R.C.M.P. handed to this office two cameras surrendered by this man. These cameras were shipped to HONKAWA on September 22, 1945, after we had received the receipts given to HONKAWA at the time of the surrender of the cameras. The cost of shipping the cameras was charged to the account of this man's father, File No. 639.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$5.00 as refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of his vessel "Maple Leaf". This amount is being remitted to HONKAWA today.

Re: Chattels.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 7th instant, with list of articles you desire to have shipped to you.

The only items on your list which are still in our possession are the 2 cameras, which are carried in your son's file, and if you will send us Mr. Pogson's receipt for these we shall be pleased to forward them, forwarding charge to be for your account.

Of the other items on your list the first, fifth, sixth and seventh (Lamps, T-squares, Tea set, etc., and Radio), were sold by auction, as per auction lists attached. The third and fourth items (Hardwood saucers and Drafting instruments) may also have been auctioned under the heading of miscellaneous lots. We have no record of the second item (2 Binoculars) and we believe these must have been amongst the goods stolen when your house was broken into. Constable E. W. Bull in his full report on this theft stated "it is impossible to find out what all is missing", the only items he was sure of being a blow torch, a set of taps and dies and some new paint brushes, but his report includes the information that the premises were "thoroughly ransacked" and we assume other goods were stolen, although subsequent efforts of the police failed to recover anything or catch the thief or thieves.

As you probably know Port Essington now has some of the appearance of a ghost town and as your property is in an isolated position facing on the Skeena River it is more than usually difficult to protect. It has been advertised for sale since the Spring of last year but in spite of the shortage in other areas, including Prince Rupert, the supply has far exceeded the demand in the case of Port Essington and we have so far failed to get an acceptable bid.

For your information we give below an extract of your account and attach auction lists giving details of these items in the account.
